### **Bill Summary**

Joint Budget Committee. For fiscal year 2011-12 or any

subsequent fiscal year, the bill authorizes the general assembly to appropriate moneys from the tobacco education programs fund to the department of health care policy and financing in order to allow the department to obtain federal matching funds for the Colorado quitline program.
