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**Joint Budget Committee.** For fiscal year 2011-12 or any subsequent fiscal year, the bill authorizes the general assembly to appropriate moneys from the tobacco education programs fund to the department of health care policy and financing in order to allow the department to obtain federal matching funds for the Colorado quitline program.

(2) There are hereby created in the state 6 treasury the following funds: 7 (c) (III.5) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2011-12 AND FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR 8 THEREAFTER, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY ANNUALLY APPROPRIATE 9 MONEYS IN THE TOBACCO EDUCATION PROGRAMS FUND TO THE 10 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CARE POLICY AND FINANCING IN ORDER TO 11 ALLOW THE DEPARTMENT TO OBTAIN FEDERAL MATCHING FUNDS FOR THE 12 COLORADO QUITLINE PROGRAM. 13 **SECTION 2.** Appropriation to the department of health care 14 policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011.
