Department of Education, Assistance to Public Schools, Public School Finance, State Share of Districts' Total Program Funding -- It is the intent of the General Assembly that the Department of Education be authorized to utilize up to \$4,647,614 of this appropriation to fund qualified students designated as Accelerating Students Through Concurrent Enrollment (ASCENT) Program participants as authorized pursuant to Section 22-35-108, C.R.S.
