A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A REPEAL OF THE MANDATORY SENTENCING
102 REQUIREMENT FOR VIOLATION OF BAIL BOND CONDITIONS.

Bill Summary

Under current law, a person who commits the offense of violation of bail bond conditions is subject to mandatory incarceration in prison for a felony and jail for a misdemeanor. The offense also requires mandatory consecutive sentencing. This bill repeals the mandatory sentencing provisions but does not change the sentencing range.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-8-212, **repeal** (3)
3 as follows:

4 **18-8-212. Violation of bail bond conditions.** (3) ~~A person~~
5 ~~convicted under this section shall not be eligible for probation or a~~
6 ~~suspended sentence and shall be sentenced to imprisonment of not less~~
7 ~~than one year for violation of subsection (1) of this section and not less~~
8 ~~than six months for violation of subsection (2) of this section. Any such~~
9 ~~sentence shall be served consecutively with any sentence for the offense~~
10 ~~on which the person is on bail.~~

11 **SECTION 2. Effective date - applicability.** This act takes effect
12 July 1, 2013, and applies to offenses committed on or after said date.

13 **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
14 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
15 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
