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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101 **CONCERNING AN EXTENSION OF THE PERIOD FOR WHICH THE**  
102 **VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION DESIGNATION LINE BENEFITING THE**  
103 **UNWANTED HORSE FUND APPEARS ON STATE INDIVIDUAL**  
104 **INCOME TAX RETURN FORMS.**

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal and reenact,**  
3 **with amendments,** 39-22-3802 as follows:

4 **39-22-3802. Voluntary contribution designation - procedure.**

5 FOR INCOME TAX YEARS COMMENCING ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 2013,  
6 BUT PRIOR TO JANUARY 1, 2018, THE COLORADO STATE INDIVIDUAL  
7 INCOME TAX RETURN FORM MUST CONTAIN A LINE WHEREBY EACH  
8 INDIVIDUAL TAXPAYER MAY DESIGNATE THE AMOUNT OF THE  
9 CONTRIBUTION, IF ANY, THE INDIVIDUAL WISHES TO MAKE TO THE  
10 UNWANTED HORSE FUND CREATED IN SECTION 39-22-3803 (1).

11 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend** 39-22-3804  
12 as follows:

13 **39-22-3804. Repeal of part.** This part 38 is repealed, effective  
14 ~~January 1 of the fourth income tax year following the year in which the~~  
15 ~~executive director files written certification with the revisor of statutes as~~  
16 ~~specified in section 39-22-3802 (2)~~ JANUARY 1, 2019, unless the  
17 voluntary contribution to the unwanted horse fund established by this part  
18 38 is continued or reestablished by the general assembly acting by bill  
19 prior to ~~said~~ THAT date.

20 **SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act  
21 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the  
22 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August  
23 7, 2013, if adjournment sine die is on May 8, 2013); except that, if a  
24 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the  
25 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act

1 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect  
2 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
3 November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the  
4 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
