Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause appropriating \$51,800 cash funds from the Wildlife Cash Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for FY 2013-14. This amount is reappropriated to the Governor's Office of Information Technology for the provision of computer programming services to the Department of Natural Resources.

Future Fiscal Impact

The Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note states that the bill is expected to increase workload in Parks and Wildlife in four areas. As the fiscal impact becomes more clear, the Department may request additional appropriations through the annual budget process.
