General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) has introduced a budget package for FY 2013-14 based on the March 2013 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. The budget package appropriates all but approximately \$8.0 million of General Fund revenues projected to be available, less a statutorily required five percent General Fund reserve. The JBC has included as part of its FY 2013-14 budget package a \$2,000,000 General Fund appropriation reduction for implementation of this bill.
