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A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE CREATION OF THE ADVANCED PLACEMENT 102 INCENTIVES PILOT PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

The bill creates the advanced placement incentives pilot program (pilot program) in the department of education. If a rural school district, as defined by the department of education, has 3,000 or fewer total K-12 students, a school within that rural school district is eligible to participate in the pilot program. The participating schools, as well as the teachers or mentors for on-line classes, are eligible to receive bonuses through the pilot program for successful completion of advanced placement classes and passage of advanced placement exams. Additional bonuses are available if the passing student is eligible for the federal student lunch program. The pilot program is repealed after 4 years.

5	22-94-103. Repeal. This article is repealed, effective July
6	1, 2017.
7	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
8	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
9	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
10	7, 2013, if adjournment sine die is on May 8, 2013); except that, if a
11	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
12	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
13	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
14	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
15	November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
16	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
