Summary of Legislation

This bill allows applicants for state-issued identification cards, who are over the age of 65, to renew online every renewal period. Identification cards expire on the card holder's birthday in the fifth year of the card's issuance. Current law allows online renewals, but only on every other renewal period.

Under this bill, in order to renew, the applicant must attest to being lawfully present in the U.S. and to being a Colorado resident. Current fees for identification cards, whether new or renewed, are waived for those age 60 or over.

State Revenue and Expenditures

In FY 2012-13, this bill requires a one-time expenditure of \$4,588 in the Department of Revenue (DOR) from the Licensing Services Cash Fund. This bill requires approximately 60 hours for reprogramming to the DOR Driver's License System, which will be performed by the Governor's Office of Information Technology.

State Appropriations

For FY 2013-14, this bill requires an appropriation of \$4,588, from the Licensing Services Cash Fund, to the Department of Revenue. This amount should be reappropriated to the Governor's Office of Information Technology (OIT).
