Summary of Legislation

The bill instructs courts in juvenile cases to limit the premature waiver of counsel by juveniles in detention hearings and to ensure that such waivers are made knowingly and voluntarily by juveniles. Juveniles are required to be free of physical restraints during hearings, unless the judge makes specific findings of fact that restraints are required to maintain order, prevent escape, or provide for safety of the courtroom.

State Expenditures

The bill will increase the amount of time required for courts to conduct juvenile detention hearings, primarily for extra hearings and rulings concerning the use of physical restraints. However, any increase in workload is expected to be minimal and can be absorbed within existing appropriations to the Judicial Department.
