 11 CHARTER SCHOOL INSTITUTE, OR A FACILITY SCHOOL.

THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ALLOCATE STATE 34 MONEYS PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION ON THE STUDENT'S BEHALF TO THE 35 LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDER THAT ENROLLS THE STUDENT.


