Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes a provision appropriating a total of \$3,795,400 General Fund and 37.9 FTE to the Judicial Branch for FY 2013-14. The components of this appropriation are detailed in the following table. The appropriation clause is effective September 1, 2013, unless a referendum petition is filed against the act. This allows the Judicial Branch to make capital outlay purchases prior to the new staff beginning work in January 2014.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

1. The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2013-14 based on the March 2013 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. The budget package allocates all but approximately \$9.0 million of General Fund revenues projected to be available. Pursuant to S.B. 13-236, this \$9.0 million General Fund will be transferred to the Colorado Water Conservation Board (CWCB) Construction Fund. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$3,795,400 for FY 2013-14 and thus will reduce the transfer to the CWCB Construction Fund by that amount. For FY 2014-15, the bill is anticipated to require a General Fund appropriation of \$7,732,939.

Future Budget Processes

2. As described on pages two and three of the attached Fiscal Note, this bill is expected to increase the workload and expenditures of the Office of the Alternate Defense Counsel (OADC). However, it is not possible to determine the number of cases that will require OADC representation as a result of an OSPD conflict of interest. Thus, any such impact will need to be addressed through the annual budget process.

Local Fiscal Impact

3. As described on page four of the attached Fiscal Note, this bill is expected to significantly increase workloads in local district attorneys' offices and could result in some defendants spending more time in county jails awaiting trial while they apply for a public defender.

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
