## **Summary of Legislation**

**Recommended by the Joint Budget Committee**, this bill creates the Office of Community Living within the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF) on July 1, 2013. On March 1, 2014, multiple programs (including all related powers, duties, and functions) serving persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities within the Department of Human Services (DHS) are transferred to HCPF by a type 2 transfer, including:

- three Home-and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Medicaid waiver programs, including Adult Comprehensive Services (HCBS-DD), Children's Extensive Services (HCBS-CES), and Supported Living Services (HCBS-SLS);
- targeted case management services for the transferring HCBS waiver programs; and
- family support services.

#### **State Expenditures**

Overall, this bill transfers 34.5 FTE and \$425.4 million in appropriations from the DHS to HCPF as of March 1, 2014. Expenditures and transfers are detailed in the State Appropriations section, below. The amounts identified for the transfer assume that staff will remain at the Fort Logan campus and that administrative costs to support the transferring programs are similar in

each department. Once the transfer begins, and should any operational decisions alter the housing of these programs, additional costs could be identified. Any such costs will be discussed during progress meetings required to occur in September 2013 and November 2013 between HCPF, stakeholders, and the Joint Budget Committee, and be requested through the annual budget process.

## **State Appropriations**

For FY 2013-14, Table 1 shows the appropriations that should be transferred from the DHS to the newly created Office of Community Living within HCPF.
