A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING LIMITATIONS ON DRUG PARAPHERNALIA LAWS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Current law exempts from the statutes dealing with drug paraphernalia persons participating as an employee or volunteer of a syringe exchange program approved by the department of public health and environment. The bill extends this exemption to persons who are participants in an approved program.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 18-18-430.5
3	as follows:
4	18-18-430.5. Drug paraphernalia - exemption. A person shall
5	be exempt from the provisions of sections 18-18-425 to 18-18-430 if he
6	or she is participating as an employee, or volunteer, OR PARTICIPANT in
7	an approved syringe exchange program created pursuant to section
8	25-1-520, C.R.S.
9	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
10	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
11	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
