Bill Summary

Current law enacted in 1893 requires the board of county commissioners of each county in the state to advertise annually in the official newspaper of the county for bids for supplying stationery supplies. In addition, counties are required to enter into a new contract for

HOUSE 2nd Reading Unamended January 28, 2013 the provisions of stationery supplies annually and county officers are prohibited from purchasing stationery supplies. The bill repeals these requirements.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal** 30-11-109 as 3 follows: 4 **30-11-109.** Advertisement for bids on supplies. (1) It is the duty 5 of the board of county commissioners in each county in this state to cause 6 at least one advertisement to be inserted in the official newspaper of its 7 respective county, under the heading of "stationery proposals", asking for 8 bids for the supplying, for one year, of all books, stationery, records, 9 printing, lithographing, and such other supplies, specifically mentioning 10 and describing them, as are furnished to the several officers of the county, 11 such advertisement to be published not less than twenty nor more than 12 forty days prior to the opening of such bids. Such advertisement may be 13 published any time during the year as the board deems most advisable. 14 The publication of the advertisement may be made in conjunction with 15 any other county or the state, when bids are asked on the supplies 16 specified in this section. 17 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this 18 section, a board of county commissioners may purchase recycled paper 19 under an existing price agreement between the state purchasing division 20 and a recycled paper supplier when such board has determined that the 21 recycled paper available through such agreement is comparable in cost 22 and quality to the paper which the county proposes to purchase. 23 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal** 30-11-111 as 24 follows:

1	30-11-111. Term of contract. No contract for the furnishing of
2	such books, stationery, records, printing, lithographing, or other supplies
3	shall be made for more than one year.
4	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, repeal 30-11-112 as
5	follows:
6	30-11-112. Officer cannot contract or purchase. No county
7	officer shall be allowed to contract for or purchase any books, stationery,
8	records, printing, lithographing, or other supplies of any kind for use in
9	his office, and no such supplies shall be procured in any other manner
10	than as provided in sections 30-11-109 to 30-11-112.
11	SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
12	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
13	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
14	7, 2013, if adjournment sine die is on May 8, 2013); except that, if a
15	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
16	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
