A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE COLORADO FOOD SYSTEMS

Bill Summary

Sunset Process - Senate Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Energy Committee. In 2010, the general assembly created the Colorado food systems advisory council (council) to foster a healthy food supply available to all Colorado residents while enhancing the state's agricultural and natural resources, encouraging economic growth, expanding the

viability of agriculture, and improving the health of Colorado's communities and residents by making recommendations to the general assembly. The council is scheduled to repeal July 1, 2013. The bill continues the council indefinitely. The bill also adds 2 more members to the committee and ensures diversity among the existing members.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-1203, **repeal** (3)

12 (b) (III); and **add** (2) (b) (VI) and (2) (b) (VII) as follows:

13 **24-37.3-102. Colorado food systems advisory council - created**

6 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal** 24-37.3-107
7 as follows:

8 **24-37.3-107. Repeal of article.** ~~This article is repealed, effective~~
9 ~~July 1, 2013. Prior to such repeal, the food systems advisory council shall~~
10 ~~be reviewed as provided for in section 2-3-1203, C.R.S.~~

11 **SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
12 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
13 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
