Bill Summary

Sunset Process - Senate Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Energy Committee. In 2010, the general assembly created the Colorado food systems advisory council (council) to foster a healthy food supply available to all Colorado residents while enhancing the state's agricultural and natural resources, encouraging economic growth, expanding the

SENATE Amended 2nd Reading February 20, 2013 viability of agriculture, and improving the health of Colorado's communities and residents by making recommendations to the general assembly. The council is scheduled to repeal July 1, 2013. The bill continues the council indefinitely. The bill also adds 2 more members to the committee and ensures diversity among the existing members.

The council may accept in-kind donations of staff 17 services from the private sector to staff the council. The council is also 18 authorized to accept and expend federal funds available for food policy 19 councils. All private and public moneys received through gifts, grants, or 20 donations shall be transmitted to the state treasurer, who shall credit the 21 same to the food systems advisory council fund, which fund is hereby 22 created and referred to in this section as the "fund". The moneys in the 23 fund shall be subject to annual appropriation MUST BE CONTINUOUSLY 24 APPROPRIATED by the general assembly to the department of agriculture 25 for allocation to the council for the direct and indirect costs associated 26 with implementing this article. Any moneys in the fund not expended for 27 the purpose of this article may be invested by the state treasurer as

1	provided by law. All interest and income derived from the investment and
2	deposit of moneys in the fund shall be credited to the fund. Any
3	unexpended and unencumbered moneys remaining in the fund at the end
4	of a fiscal year shall remain in the fund and shall not revert or be credited
5	or transferred to the general fund or another fund; except that, if, at the
6	time this article is repealed pursuant to section 24-37.3-107, the fund
7	contains a balance of unencumbered and unexpended moneys, those
8	moneys shall revert to the general fund.
