Sunset Process - Senate Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Energy Committee. The bill continues the state noxious weed advisory committee indefinitely. 2 nonvoting members are added to the committee. One represents the Colorado department of transportation and the other represents the department of natural resources. The committee is also

8	(I) The state noxious weed advisory committee created in section
9	35-5.5-108.7, C.R.S.;

11	(I) THE STATE NOXIOUS WEED ADVISORY COMMITTEE CREATED IN
12	<u>SECTION 35-5.5-108.7, C.R.S.;</u>
13	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 35-5.5-108.7, amend
14	(1) (a), (2) (c), (2) (d), and (5); and <b>add</b> (2) (e) as follows:
15	35-5.5-108.7. State noxious weed advisory committee.
16	(1) (a) (I) There is hereby created the state noxious weed advisory
17	committee, referred to in this section as the "state advisory committee".
18	The state advisory committee shall consist CONSISTS of fifteen
19	SEVENTEEN members. Such members shall be FIFTEEN MEMBERS ARE
20	appointed by the commissioner and shall serve without per diem
21	compensation or expenses. Of the fifteen members:
22	(A) At least one member shall represent REPRESENTS private and
23	public landowners or land managers;
24	(B) At least two members shall represent weed management
25	professionals from the federal, state, or local levels;

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1	(C) At least one member shall represent REPRESENTS public or
2	private weed scientists;
3	(D) At least two members shall represent local governing bodies;
4	(E) Four members shall be MUST BE agricultural producers, as
5	defined in section 35-1-102; and
6	(F) At least three members shall represent knowledgeable
7	resource specialists or industries, including but not limited to,
8	environmental organizations.
9	(II) THE REMAINING TWO MEMBERS ARE:
10	(A) One nonvoting member who is appointed by the
11	COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION WITH THE APPROVAL OF
12	THE COMMISSIONER; AND
13	(B) One nonvoting member who is appointed by the
14	DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE
15	COMMISSIONER.
16	(III) Representation on the state advisory committee shall MUST
17	reflect the different geographic areas of the state equally, to the greatest
18	extent possible. Members of the state advisory committee that represent
19	the various stakeholders and regions shall solicit input from similar
20	stakeholders within each member's area of expertise and region of the
21	state. Members of the state advisory committee shall communicate the
22	committee's recommendations to the region and stakeholders represented
23	by each member.

9	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
10	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
11	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
