A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE MOTORCYCLE OPERATOR SAFETY TRAINING
 102 PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

The bill directs the office of transportation safety to set standards for the motorcycle operator safety training program (program), both for students and instructors. Meeting the standards qualifies a student to get a motorcycle endorsement on the student's driver's license. The office will also establish a system to record program data, including accidents, injuries, and fatalities.

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A person who is eligible for a driver's license with a motorcycle endorsement from another state and is now a Colorado resident will be eligible for the program. The bill repeals a requirement that a program course charge be the same for all students.

The bill prohibits expending program moneys on program vendor operating expenses or motorcycles, helmets, textbooks, and other capital expenses, except for mobile training expenses.

The motorcycle operator safety advisory board (board) is recreated, consisting of 12 members who represent:

- The office of transportation safety's director;
- The department of revenue's executive director;
- ! The chief of the Colorado state patrol;
- ! For-profit program vendors;
- ! Nonprofit program vendors;
- ! Retail motorcycle dealers;
- ! Third-party testers;
- ! Program instructor training specialists;
- ! The motorcycle riding community;
- ! Motorcycle training providers not affiliated with the program;
- ! Law enforcement agencies; and
- ! Motorcycle insurance providers.

The board's duties are to recommend training methods to increase safety and program effectiveness, recommend improvements to the program and training, and make recommendations on expenditures of motorcycle operator safety training fund moneys. The board meets quarterly.

By September 1 of each year, the department of transportation makes an annual report to the legislative audit committee, house transportation committee, and senate transportation committee. The report must comment on the effectiveness of the program, annual motorcycle deaths, availability of training throughout the state, historic and current training costs, and other performance measures.

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 43-5-501, **amend** (1);

3 **add** (1.5), (3.5), (3.6), and (6); and **repeal** (5) as follows:

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43-5-501. Definitions. As used in this part 5, unless the context

15 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 43-5-502 as
16 follows:

17 43-5-502. Motorcycle operator safety training program - rules. 18 (1) (a) (I) The office shall establish a motorcycle operator safety training 19 program which shall include THAT PROMOTES MOTORCYCLE SAFETY 20 AWARENESS AND SUPPORTS courses to develop the knowledge, attitudes, 21 habits, and skills necessary for the safe operation of a motorcycle. Such 22 TEACH STUDENTS TO SAFELY OPERATE A MOTORCYCLE AND TRAIN 23 INSTRUCTOR TRAINING SPECIALISTS. TO BE ELIGIBLE UNDER THE program, 24 shall A COURSE MUST include instruction relating to ON the effects of 25 alcohol and drugs on the operation of motorcycles. and it shall include a 26 course to train instructors. The office shall set standards for the 27 certification of courses in the program, ENSURE THAT PROGRAM TRAINING FOLLOWS THESE STANDARDS, AND ENSURE THAT COURSES ARE OFFERED
 SAFELY, CONSISTENT WITH BEST PRACTICES. The office shall contract with
 MOST vendors for the purpose of providing the program.

4 (I.5) TO QUALIFY UNDER THE PROGRAM, A BASIC TRAINING COURSE
5 PROVIDED BY A MOST VENDOR MUST TEACH THE REQUIREMENTS FOR
6 ISSUING A DRIVER'S LICENSE MOTORCYCLE ENDORSEMENT.

7 (II) The following individuals may enroll in a certified motorcycle
8 operator safety training course:

9 (A) Any A resident of the state who holds a current valid 10 Colorado driver's license, a minor driver's license, or an instruction permit 11 authorized by section 42-2-106, C.R.S.; or

(B) Any individual who is A member of the armed forces who has
moved to Colorado on a permanent change-of-station basis and who holds
a valid driver's license issued by another state; AND

15 (C) AN ADULT WHO HOLDS A VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE FROM
16 ANOTHER STATE, WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR A MOTORCYCLE LICENSE IN THE
17 SAME STATE, AND WHO PROVIDES PROOF OF COLORADO RESIDENCY.

(III) The charge for enrollment in the certified motorcycle
 operator training course shall be the same regardless of whether an
 individual qualifies for the course pursuant to sub-subparagraph (A) or
 (B) of subparagraph (II) of this paragraph (a).

(b) The director may certify any person meeting the applicable
standards as an instructor training specialist to assist in establishing
motorcycle operator safety training courses throughout the state, in
implementing the program, and in training and monitoring instructors
THE OFFICE SHALL PROMULGATE RULES ESTABLISHING STANDARDS FOR
MOST VENDORS TO PROVIDE TRAINING SERVICES. THE OFFICE SHALL

PROMULGATE RULES ESTABLISHING A SYSTEM TO RECORD PROGRAM
 PERFORMANCE DATA, INCLUDING INFORMATION ON MOTORCYCLE
 ACCIDENTS, INJURIES, AND FATALITIES AMONG PERSONS WHO HAVE
 COMPLETED THE PROGRAM.

5 (c) The director shall designate a program coordinator to 6 implement and administer the program. In no event shall the office 7 expend more than fifteen percent of the total cost of the program for 8 administrative costs The program coordinator may certify 9 INSTRUCTOR TRAINING SPECIALISTS WHO MEET THE APPLICABLE 10 STANDARDS. THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ESTABLISH 11 STANDARDS FOR RECERTIFICATION TRAINING AND MONITORING OF MOST 12 INSTRUCTORS.

13 (d) The office shall adopt such rules and regulations as are
14 necessary to carry out the provisions of the program pursuant to article 4
15 of title 24, C.R.S.

16 (e) THE OFFICE SHALL NOT EXPEND MORE THAN FIFTEEN PERCENT
17 OF THE TOTAL COST OF THE PROGRAM FOR ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS.

(2) The office shall begin implementation of this part 5 on
 November 1, 1990, or when the moneys in the fund are sufficient to pay
 for the costs of implementing the program, whichever is later. However,
 operation of courses in the program shall commence no later than July 1,
 1991.

23 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 43-5-503 as
 24 follows:

43-5-503. MOST instructor requirements and training.
(1) The office shall establish standards for an approved MOST instructor
training course. Successful completion of TO SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE

the course, shall require the participant to A STUDENT MUST demonstrate
 knowledge of course material, knowledge of safe motorcycle operating
 practices, and the necessary aptitude for instructing students.

4 (2) TO BE ELIGIBLE, each applicant for an instructor certificate
5 shall MUST be at least twenty-one years of age and hold a valid Colorado
6 driver's license THAT IS endorsed for motorcycles which license AND THAT
7 has not been revoked or suspended within the three years preceding
8 BEFORE the date on which the application for certification is made IS
9 FILED.

10 (3) No applicant shall be certified as an A MOST instructor if,
11 within the three years preceding BEFORE the date on which the application
12 for certification is made IS FILED:

(a) The applicant was convicted for an offense which THAT is
assigned eight or more points in the point system schedule, as specified
in section 42-2-127 (5), C.R.S., or its equivalent in another state; or

16 (b) The applicant's driver's license from any other state was17 revoked or suspended.

(4) The office shall prescribe the form for an approved MOST
instructor certificate and shall provide for verification that a certified
MOST instructor is currently active in the program. No instructor shall
participate in the program without a current certificate TO BE ELIGIBLE
FOR THE PROGRAM, A MOST INSTRUCTOR MUST HAVE A CURRENT
CERTIFICATE.

24 SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 43-5-504 as
25 follows:

43-5-504. Motorcycle operator safety training fund. (1) There
 THE MOTORCYCLE OPERATOR SAFETY TRAINING FUND is hereby created in

1 the state treasury. a motorcycle operator safety training fund which shall 2 consist THE FUND CONSISTS of moneys collected pursuant to UNDER 3 sections 42-2-114 (2) (b) and (4) (b), 42-2-118 (1) (b) (II), and 42-3-304 4 (4), C.R.S. The moneys in the fund shall be ARE available immediately, without further appropriation, for allocation by the transportation 5 6 commission to the office of transportation safety to be used for the 7 implementation and administration of the program. Moneys credited to 8 the fund shall remain therein at the end of each fiscal year and shall ARE 9 not be transferred to any other fund.

10 (2) THE DIRECTOR, THE PROGRAM COORDINATOR, OR A MOST
11 VENDOR SHALL NOT EXPEND OR CREDIT MONEYS FOR MOST VENDOR
12 OPERATING EXPENSES OR REIMBURSE MOTORCYCLES, HELMETS,
13 TEXTBOOKS, AND OTHER CAPITAL EXPENSES INCURRED BY MOST
14 VENDORS, EXCLUDING THE COSTS OF MOBILE TRAINING.

SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, recreate and
 reenact, with amendments, 43-5-505 as follows:

43-5-505. Advisory board. (1) THE MOTORCYCLE OPERATOR
SAFETY ADVISORY BOARD IS HEREBY CREATED. THE BOARD CONSISTS OF:

(a) THE DIRECTOR OR THE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE;

20 (b) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE
21 OR THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE;

(c) THE CHIEF OF THE COLORADO STATE PATROL OR THE CHIEF'S
DESIGNEE; AND

(d) NINE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF
THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, OF WHICH ONE MEMBER
REPRESENTS EACH OF THE FOLLOWING:

10	(2) THE BOARD SHALL MEET TO:

13	(b) RECOMMEND TRAINING METHODS TO INCREASE PROGRAM
14	EFFECTIVENESS;
15	(c) RECOMMEND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE PROGRAM AND TRAINING;
16	AND
17	(d) Make recommendations on expenditures of fund
18	MONEYS.
19	(3) EACH BOARD MEMBER APPOINTED UNDER PARAGRAPH (d) OF
20	SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION SERVES A TWO-YEAR TERM; EXCEPT
21	THAT, OF THE BOARD MEMBERS APPOINTED INITIALLY, ONE-HALF SERVE
22	FOR A ONE-YEAR TERM AND THE REMAINING MEMBERS SERVE A TWO-YEAR
23	TERM.
24	(4) THE BOARD SHALL ELECT FROM AMONG THE BOARD MEMBERS
25	LISTED IN PARAGRAPHS (a) TO (c) OF SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION A
26	CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR, BOTH OF WHOM SERVE TWO-YEAR TERMS. THE

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2 (5) THE BOARD SHALL DEVELOP A VISION AND MISSION
3 CONSISTENT WITH THE PROGRAM.

(6) THE BOARD SHALL MEET AT LEAST QUARTERLY.

5 SECTION 6. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 43-5-506 and
6 43-5-507 as follows:

7 **43-5-506. Report.** NO LATER THAN SEPTEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, 8 THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL REPORT TO THE 9 LEGISLATIVE AUDIT COMMITTEE AND THE HOUSE AND SENATE 10 TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEES, OR THEIR SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES. THE 11 REPORT MUST COMMENT ON THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PROGRAM, 12 ANNUAL MOTORCYCLE ACCIDENTS OR FATALITIES, AVAILABILITY OF 13 TRAINING THROUGHOUT THE STATE, HISTORIC AND CURRENT TRAINING 14 COSTS, AND OTHER PERFORMANCE MEASURES.

43-5-507. Repeal. This PART 5 is REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
2016.

SECTION 7. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, add
(47.5) (k) as follows:

19 24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies
20 and functions for termination, continuation, or reestablishment.
21 (47.5) The following agencies, functions, or both, shall terminate on
22 September 1, 2016:

(k) THE MOST PROGRAM CREATED BY PART 5 OF ARTICLE 5 OF
TITLE 43, C.R.S.

25 SECTION 8. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
 26 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
 27 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August

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7, 2013, if adjournment sine die is on May 8, 2013); except that, if a
referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
