Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Legislative Audit Committee. Current law requires the state controller to contract with one or more experienced consultants to

conduct recovery audits on or before:

- ! July 1, 2014, for recovery audits for the 2010-11, 2011-12, and 2012-13 fiscal years; and
- ! On or before July 1 of every third year thereafter to conduct recovery audits for the period of 3 fiscal years that ends on the immediately preceding June 30.

In order to allow the Colorado Financial Reporting System (COFRS) modernization project to be completed and all relevant data to be entered into the modernized COFRS system before the next series of recovery audits is conducted, the bill extends the deadline for the state controller to contract with one or more experienced consultants to conduct recovery audits until:

- ! July 31, 2017, for recovery audits for the 2014-15, 2015-16, and 2016-17 fiscal years; and
- ! July 31 of every third year thereafter for recovery audits for the period of 3 fiscal years that ends on the immediately preceding June 30.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-30-203.5, amend

3 (3) (a), (4) (b), and (6) (c) as follows:

4 24-30-203.5. Recovery audits - legislative declaration -

5 **contracting - reporting - definitions.** (3) (a) On or before July 1, 2011,

6 the state controller shall contract with one or more experienced

7 consultants to conduct recovery audits for the 2007-08, 2008-09, and

8 2009-10 fiscal years. On or before July 1, 2011 JULY 31, 2017, and on or

9 before July 1 JULY 31 of every third year thereafter, the state controller

shall contract with one or more experienced consultants to conduct

recovery audits for the period of three fiscal years that ends on the June

30 immediately preceding the applicable July 1 JULY 31 contracting

deadline.

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14 (4) (b) For recovery audits for the 2007-08, 2008-09, and 2009-10

15 fiscal years, the state controller shall provide the state auditor and the

legislative audit and joint budget committees with a report by March 1,

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2011, that details any exemptions from recovery audits proposed to be allowed by the state controller. For the 2010-11 2014-15 fiscal year and for any fiscal year thereafter in which the state controller proposes to change the exemptions from recovery audits, the state controller shall provide a report of the proposed changes to the state auditor and the legislative audit and joint budget committees by the March 1 that immediately precedes the execution of one or more recovery audit contracts for the applicable fiscal year. The legislative audit and joint budget committees may veto any exemption from recovery audits proposed by the state controller by majority votes of the members of each of the committees taken before June 30, 2011 JUNE 30, 2017, and taken before June 30 of each year thereafter in which the state controller proposes a change in the exemptions from recovery audits.

(6) (c) Not later than June 30, 2012 JUNE 30, 2018, and not later than June 30 of every third year thereafter, the state controller shall issue a report to the general assembly summarizing the contents of all reports received from consultants that performed recovery audits contracted for pursuant to this section. The report shall also be posted on the web site of the state controller.

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
