Bill Summary

Current law defines veterinary premises as a veterinary office or other location in which veterinary medicine is practiced by, or under the direct or immediate supervision of, a licensed veterinarian. The bill expands this definition to include a place where veterinary medicine is practiced under the direction and supervision of a licensed veterinarian, 3rd Reading Unamended April 26, 2013

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-64-103, amend
3	(17) as follows:

6	(17) "Veterinary premises" or "premises" means any A veterinary
7	office, hospital, clinic, or temporary location in which veterinary
8	medicine is being practiced by or under the direct or immediate
9	supervision UNDER THE DIRECTION AND SUPERVISION of a licensed
10	veterinarian.
11	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
12	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
13	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
