Bill Summary

The bill creates an economic gardening pilot project in the Colorado office of economic development (office). Through the pilot

project, staff members of the office and small business development centers (SBDCs) who have been trained and certified in economic gardening principles and practices provide 12 months of strategic assistance to at least 20 Colorado-headquartered second-stage companies and SBDC clients selected by the state director of SBDCs in the office. The state director reports annually on the results of the pilot project to the general assembly, and the pilot project terminates in 2016.

| 4 | (a) Colorado's persistently high unemployment rate during the |
| 5 | recent recession has created economic and social hardships for the people |
| 6 | of the state; |
| 7 | (b) Local start-up companies and small businesses are likely, as |
| 8 | they grow, to remain in their communities of origin, thereby creating local |
| 9 | jobs and an economic multiplier effect with their payrolls and taxes while |
| 10 | providing local economic stimuli, which increases the local tax base; |
| 11 | (c) Statewide economic prosperity and job creation are advanced |
| 12 | significantly by creating, promoting, and retaining local start-up |
| 13 | companies and small businesses with high growth potential; |
| 14 | (d) Entrepreneurs and small business owners of second-stage |
| 15 | companies, which are those companies that are beyond the start-up stage |
| 16 | but have not yet fully matured, with innovative products or services that |
| 17 | satisfy market needs, have particular potential for expansion and job |

| 19 | (e) Such entrepreneurs and owners can benefit from specialized |

2 (f) The aspects of economic gardening that incorporate these
3 principles have proven successful in improving the entrepreneurial
4 process and promoting economically sustainable local businesses; and

5 (g) It is important to the overall health and growth of the state's
6 economy to promote favorable conditions for those expanding Colorado
7 businesses that demonstrate the ability to grow.

8 (2) In recognition of the foregoing findings and principles, it is the 9 intent of the general assembly to create a Colorado economic gardening 10 pilot project in the Colorado office of economic development.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 24-48.5-102.5
as follows:

17 (a) "COLORADO COMPANIES TO WATCH" MEANS BUSINESSES THAT
18 HAVE BEEN NOMINATED AND MET THE ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR AN
19 AWARDS PROGRAM OPERATED BY A NATIONAL PHILANTHROPIC
20 FOUNDATION IDENTIFIED BY THE STATE DIRECTOR, REGARDLESS OF
21 WHETHER THE BUSINESSES ACTUALLY WON AWARDS SUBSEQUENT TO
22 NOMINATION.

(b) "ECONOMIC GARDENING" MEANS AN APPROACH TO ECONOMIC
GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT THAT EMPHASIZES NURTURING AND
CULTIVATING LOCAL SMALL BUSINESSES BY PROVIDING STRATEGIC
ASSISTANCE TO SECOND-STAGE COMPANIES.

27 (c) "Key industry" means an industry critical to the

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1 COLORADO ECONOMY, AS IDENTIFIED BY THE OFFICE.

2 (d) "OFFICE" MEANS THE COLORADO OFFICE OF ECONOMIC
3 DEVELOPMENT CREATED IN SECTION 24-48.5-101.

4 (e) "PILOT PROJECT" MEANS THE ECONOMIC GARDENING PILOT
5 PROJECT CREATED IN THIS SECTION.

6 (f) "SECOND-STAGE COMPANY" MEANS A PRIVATELY HELD
7 BUSINESS THAT:

8 (I) EMPLOYS FULL-TIME AT LEAST SIX PERSONS BUT NOT MORE
9 THAN NINETY-NINE PERSONS;

10 (II) HAS MAINTAINED ITS PRINCIPAL PLACE OF BUSINESS AND A
11 MAJORITY OF ITS EMPLOYEES IN COLORADO FOR AT LEAST THE PREVIOUS
12 TWO YEARS;

13 (III) CLAIMS AT LEAST FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS BUT
14 NOT MORE THAN FIFTY MILLION DOLLARS AS ANNUAL GROSS REVENUE OR
15 WORKING CAPITAL; AND

16 (IV) HAS A PRODUCT OR SERVICE THAT IS, OR HAS THE POTENTIAL
17 TO BE, SOLD OUTSIDE THE COMPANY'S LOCAL AREA OR STATE.

18 (g) "STATE DIRECTOR" MEANS THE STATE DIRECTOR OF SMALL
19 BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTERS, OR ANY SUCCESSOR DIVISION, IN THE
20 OFFICE.

(h) "STRATEGIC ASSISTANCE" OR "ECONOMIC GARDENING
STRATEGIC ASSISTANCE" MEANS PERFORMING HIGH-LEVEL CONSULTING OR
DATABASE RESEARCH AND ANALYSIS OR THE DEPLOYMENT OF OFFICE AND
SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER STAFF MEMBERS CERTIFIED
UNDER SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION TO PERFORM MARKET RESEARCH,
DEVELOP CORE STRATEGIES, CONDUCT BUSINESS MODELING, IDENTIFY
QUALIFIED SALES LEADS, PROVIDE GROWTH FINANCING REFERRALS,

PERFORM SEARCH ENGINE OPTIMIZATION, UTILIZE GEOGRAPHIC
 INFORMATION SYSTEMS, ADVISE ON NEW MEDIA MARKETING, OR ASSIST
 WITH NETWORK ANALYSES AND INNOVATION STRATEGIES.

4 (2) THERE IS HEREBY CREATED WITHIN THE OFFICE THE ECONOMIC
5 GARDENING PILOT PROJECT. THE PURPOSE OF THE PILOT PROJECT IS TO
6 STIMULATE COLORADO'S ECONOMY AND CREATE GOOD-PAYING,
7 SUSTAINABLE JOBS BY PROVIDING ECONOMIC GARDENING STRATEGIC
8 ASSISTANCE SERVICES TO SECOND-STAGE COMPANIES IN ACCORDANCE
9 WITH THIS SECTION.

10 (3) THE STATE DIRECTOR SHALL OVERSEE, AND DIRECT ALL 11 RESOURCES FOR THE EXECUTION OF, THE PILOT PROJECT, INCLUDING 12 DEVELOPING THE PROCESSES FOR QUALIFYING AND SELECTING 13 SECOND-STAGE COMPANIES, IDENTIFYING TRAINING COMPONENTS FOR 14 OFFICE AND SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER STAFF MEMBERS, 15 ENGAGING TRAINED AND CERTIFIED ECONOMIC GARDENING PRIVATE 16 CONTRACTORS AS NECESSARY, AND PROVIDING ECONOMIC GARDENING 17 STRATEGIC ASSISTANCE TO COMPANIES PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT 18 PROJECT.

(4) (a) (I) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2013, THE STATE
DIRECTOR SHALL INITIATE A PROGRAM TO PROVIDE OR OBTAIN ALL
NECESSARY CREDENTIALS FOR HIGH-IMPACT STRATEGIC ASSISTANCE TO
STAFF MEMBERS OF THE OFFICE AND SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT
CENTERS.

24 (II) PRIOR TO THE DATE THAT STRATEGIC ASSISTANCE IS PROVIDED
25 PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (4):

26 (A) AT LEAST EIGHT STAFF MEMBERS OF SMALL BUSINESS
 27 DEVELOPMENT CENTERS IN THE STATE MUST BE CERTIFIED IN ECONOMIC

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GARDENING BY A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED CERTIFYING ENTITY
 IDENTIFIED BY THE STATE DIRECTOR; AND

3 (B) THE STATE DIRECTOR SHALL, AS NECESSARY, CONTRACT WITH
4 TRAINED AND CERTIFIED ECONOMIC GARDENING PRIVATE CONTRACTORS.
5 (III) AFTER THE SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER STAFF
6 MEMBERS ARE CERTIFIED PURSUANT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS

PARAGRAPH (a), THE STATE DIRECTOR SHALL USE THE EXISTING
INFRASTRUCTURE OF SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTERS TO
PROMOTE THE PILOT PROJECT TO SECOND-STAGE COMPANIES AND TO
THOSE SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER CLIENTS AND REFERRALS
THAT, IN THE STATE DIRECTOR'S OPINION, SHOW GROWTH POTENTIAL IN
JOBS, SALES, OR EXPORT POTENTIAL.

13 (b) (I) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2013, THE STATE DIRECTOR 14 SHALL PUBLISH CRITERIA FOR A SECOND-STAGE COMPANY TO BE 15 SELECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROJECT. THE CRITERIA MUST 16 INCLUDE JOB GROWTH POTENTIAL, SUSTAINABILITY, EXPORT POTENTIAL, 17 AND A WORKFORCE COMPRISED OF AT LEAST FIFTY PERCENT COLORADO 18 **RESIDENTS. APPLICATION CRITERIA MUST ALSO INCLUDE REQUIREMENTS** 19 FOR DATA COLLECTION, AS SPECIFIED BY THE STATE DIRECTOR, TO SHOW 20 THE IMPACTS OF SERVICES PROVIDED THROUGH THE PILOT PROJECT. THE 21 STATE DIRECTOR SHALL IDENTIFY SECOND-STAGE COMPANIES

ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE BY UTILIZING THE OFFICE'S EXISTING
STRATEGIC INFRASTRUCTURE AND BY CONSULTING WITH LOCAL AND
REGIONAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PARTNERS, SUCH AS LOCAL SERVICE
CORPS OF RETIRED EXECUTIVES, SMALL BUSINESS COUNSELING OFFICES,
CHAMBERS OF COMMERCE, REGIONAL BUILDING ALLIANCES, ECONOMIC
DEVELOPMENT CORPS, AND OTHER LOCAL OR REGIONAL ECONOMIC

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DEVELOPMENT ENTITIES. THE ELIGIBLE COMPANIES AND CLIENTS SHALL
 INCLUDE SECOND-STAGE COMPANIES IN SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT
 CENTERS' CLIENT LISTS, KEY INDUSTRY NETWORKS, REGIONAL
 DEVELOPMENT PLANNING GROUPS, AND COLORADO COMPANIES TO WATCH
 APPLICANTS.

6 (II) IN ORDER TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROJECT, A COMPANY
7 SELECTED FOR PARTICIPATION MUST PAY A ONE-TIME FEE OF SEVEN
8 HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS, WHICH MONEYS SHALL BE DEPOSITED INTO THE
9 ECONOMIC GARDENING PILOT PROJECT FUND, CREATED IN SUBSECTION (5)
10 OF THIS SECTION, FOR REINVESTMENT IN THE PILOT PROJECT.

11 (c) ON OR BEFORE MARCH 1, 2014, THE STATE DIRECTOR SHALL
12 SELECT A MINIMUM OF TWENTY COMPANIES TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT
13 PROJECT.

14 (d) (I) THE STATE DIRECTOR SHALL OVERSEE THE OFFICE AND 15 SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER STAFF MEMBERS CERTIFIED 16 PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (4) OR CERTIFIED 17 PRIVATE CONTRACTORS TO DEPLOY STRATEGIC ASSISTANCE TO ALL PILOT 18 PROJECT PARTICIPANTS. THE STATE DIRECTOR SHALL ACQUIRE ANY TOOLS 19 THAT HE OR SHE DEEMS NECESSARY TO PROVIDE THE STRATEGIC 20 ASSISTANCE, INCLUDING DATABASE LICENSES, PERMITS, AND ECONOMIC 21 GARDENING CERTIFICATION.

(II) A PARTICIPATING COMPANY HAS TWELVE MONTHS FROM THE
DATE THAT THE STATE DIRECTOR SELECTS THE COMPANY TO PARTICIPATE
IN THE PILOT PROJECT TO USE THE STRATEGIC ASSISTANCE AND OTHER
ECONOMIC GARDENING SERVICES OFFERED PURSUANT TO THE PILOT
PROJECT.

5 SECTION 3. Appropriation. In addition to any other 6 appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the 7 general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the governor - lieutenant 8 governor - state planning and budgeting, for the fiscal year beginning July 9 1, 2013, the sum of \$200,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary. 10 for allocation to economic development programs for the economic 11 development gardening pilot project created by this act.

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SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 7, 2013, if adjournment sine die is on May 8, 2013); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 20 November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
