Bill Summary

Under the pharmacy practice act, an intern is permitted to practice a limited scope of pharmacy under the supervision of a licensed pharmacist while progressing toward full licensure. An intern is defined to include a person who is licensed as a pharmacist in this or another state and in good standing, and is making the clinical rotations of the SENATE nd Reading Unamended May 3, 2013

13	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
14	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
15	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
