A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE "COLORADO COTTAGE FOODS ACT".

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

The bill amends the "Colorado Cottage Foods Act" to clarify the food handling and safety course requirement for producers. Food producers under the act are exempted from regulation under the "Farm Products Act". A person is allowed to sell up to 250 dozen eggs per month under the act.

17	dehydrated produce, nuts, seeds, honey, jams, jellies, preserves, fruit
18	butter, and baked goods, including candies.
19	(II) A PERSON MAY SELL WHOLE EGGS UNDER THIS SECTION;
20	EXCEPT THAT A PERSON MAY NOT SELL MORE THAN TWO HUNDRED FIFTY
21	DOZEN WHOLE EGGS PER MONTH UNDER THIS SECTION. A PERSON SELLING

24	(c) A producer must be certified in safe food handling and

12	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 35-21-105, amend (2)
13	(b) as follows:
14	35-21-105. Exemption. (2) A person transporting eggs for sale
15	at a farmers' market or similar venue under subsection (1) of this section
16	shall:
17	(b) Affix to the egg package a label containing the address at
18	which the eggs originated and the date on which the eggs were packaged.
19	Any eggs not treated for salmonella must also include the following
20	statement on the package: "Safe Handling Instructions: To prevent illness
21	from bacteria, keep eggs refrigerated, cook eggs until yolks are firm, and
22	cook any foods containing eggs thoroughly. THESE EGGS DO NOT COME
23	FROM A GOVERNMENT-APPROVED SOURCE."
24	SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
25	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
26	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
