#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE STATUTORY DEFINITION OF A DEADLY WEAPON.

### **Bill Summary**

Under current law, for the purposes of criminal law, a deadly weapon is defined as a firearm, whether loaded or unloaded; a knife; a bludgeon; or any other weapon, device, instrument, material, or substance, whether animate or inanimate, that in the manner it is used or intended to be used is capable of producing death or serious bodily injury.

The bill modifies this definition so that a firearm, whether loaded or unloaded, qualifies as a deadly weapon regardless of the manner in

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-1-901, amend (3)
3	(e) as follows:
4	<b>18-1-901. Definitions.</b> (3) (e) "Deadly weapon" means: any of
5	the following which in the manner it is used or intended to be used is
6	capable of producing death or serious bodily injury:
7	(I) A firearm, whether loaded or unloaded; OR
8	(II) A knife, BLUDGEON, OR ANY OTHER WEAPON, DEVICE,
9	INSTRUMENT, MATERIAL, OR SUBSTANCE, WHETHER ANIMATE OR
10	INANIMATE, THAT, IN THE MANNER IT IS USED OR INTENDED TO BE USED,
11	IS CAPABLE OF PRODUCING DEATH OR SERIOUS BODILY INJURY.
12	(III) A bludgeon; or
13	(IV) Any other weapon, device, instrument, material, or
14	substance, whether animate or inanimate.
15	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
16	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
17	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
