Bill Summary

Procurement technical assistance programs offer education, counseling, and technical assistance to businesses and entrepreneurs to compete for government contracts. Currently, a procurement technical assistance center operates as a nonprofit organization in certain regions

The bill creates a procurement technical assistance task force to discuss and determine the future structure and oversight of procurement technical assistance centers in Colorado and specifies the membership of the task force.

The bill requires the task force to meet as necessary after the first regular session of the 69th general assembly and specifies the issues that the task force is required to address. All staff needed to assist the task force in conducting its duties shall be provided by the Colorado office of economic development (office). The members of the task force are required to serve without compensation.

The bill requires the general assembly to appropriate moneys to the office to be used for costs incurred in connection with the task force.

In addition, the bill requires the office to provide financial assistance for the 2013-14 fiscal year, subject to available appropriations, to an organization in the state that offers procurement technical assistance to businesses and entrepreneurs to help the organization satisfy its financial obligations to receive matching moneys from the federal government for the purpose of providing procurement technical assistance.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 24-48.5-117 and

4	24-48.5-117. Procurement technical assistance task force -
5	members - duties - legislative declaration - repeal. (1) (a) THE
6	GENERAL ASSEMBLY HEREBY FINDS, DETERMINES, AND DECLARES THAT:
7	(I) COLORADO BUSINESSES AND ENTREPRENEURS NEED THE
8	CAPABILITY AND CAPACITY TO COMPETE FOR GOVERNMENT CONTRACTS
9	AT THE FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL LEVELS;
10	(II) GOVERNMENT CONTRACTING, AT ALL LEVELS, IS A
11	COMPETITIVE PROCESS;
12	(III) A PROCUREMENT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM OFFERS
13	EDUCATION, COUNSELING, AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO BUSINESSES
14	AND ENTREPRENEURS TO COMPETE FOR GOVERNMENT CONTRACTS; AND

(IV) THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT WILL MATCH THE STATE'S

4 (b) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FURTHER FINDS AND DECLARES THAT 5 THE CREATION OF A TASK FORCE TO DISCUSS AND DETERMINE THE FUTURE 6 STRUCTURE AND OVERSIGHT OF PROCUREMENT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE 7 CENTERS IN COLORADO IS NECESSARY TO ENSURE THAT SUCH CENTERS 8 MAY CONTINUE TO PROVIDE EFFICIENT AND EFFECTIVE PROCUREMENT 9 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE RESOURCES TO COLORADO BUSINESSES AND 10 ENTREPRENEURS.

11 (2) THERE IS HEREBY CREATED THE PROCUREMENT TECHNICAL
12 ASSISTANCE TASK FORCE, REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE "TASK
13 FORCE". THE TASK FORCE CONSISTS OF EIGHT MEMBERS AS FOLLOWS:

14 (a) FOUR MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, APPOINTED AS15 FOLLOWS:

16 (I) ONE MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES APPOINTED
17 BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES;

18 (II) ONE MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES APPOINTED
19 BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES;

20 (III) ONE MEMBER OF THE SENATE APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT
21 OF THE SENATE; AND

(IV) ONE MEMBER OF THE SENATE APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY
 LEADER OF THE SENATE;

(b) Two representatives from the Colorado office of
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT APPOINTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF
THE COLORADO OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT;

27 (c) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION

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THAT CURRENTLY PROVIDES PROCUREMENT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE IN
 THE STATE; AND

3 (d) A BOARD MEMBER OF THE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT
4 CURRENTLY PROVIDES PROCUREMENT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE IN THE
5 STATE, WHO SHALL BE CHOSEN BY THE TWO MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF
6 REPRESENTATIVES WHO ARE APPOINTED TO SERVE ON THE TASK FORCE.

7 (3) THE TASK FORCE SHALL BE CO-CHAIRED BY ONE LEGISLATIVE
8 MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE, WHO SHALL BE CHOSEN BY THE MEMBERS OF
9 THE TASK FORCE, AND BY ONE MEMBER FROM THE COLORADO OFFICE OF
10 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, WHO SHALL BE CHOSEN BY THE EXECUTIVE
11 DIRECTOR OF THE COLORADO OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

12 (4) THE TASK FORCE SHALL MEET AS NECESSARY, AS DETERMINED 13 BY THE MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE, AFTER THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION 14 OF THE SIXTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY. THE TASK FORCE MAY INVITE 15 REPRESENTATIVES FROM STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES, 16 BUSINESSES OR ENTREPRENEURS, CHAMBERS OF COMMERCE, OR OTHER 17 PUBLIC OR PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE MEETINGS OF 18 THE TASK FORCE, AS DEEMED NECESSARY AND APPROPRIATE BY THE 19 MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE. THE TASK FORCE SHALL COMPLETE ITS 20 WORK AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IF 21 NECESSARY, ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2014.

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(5) THE TASK FORCE SHALL:

(a) DISCUSS BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES AND CREATE A
MANAGEMENT STRATEGY FOR THE FUTURE OF PROCUREMENT TECHNICAL
ASSISTANCE CENTERS IN THE STATE;

5 (d) EVALUATE BEST PRACTICES DERIVED FROM THE OTHER 6 PROCUREMENT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE CENTERS THROUGHOUT THE 7 UNITED STATES, INCLUDING THE POSSIBILITY OF INTEGRATING 8 PROCUREMENT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE CENTERS INTO THE EXISTING 9 SMALL BUSINESS RESOURCE CENTER STRUCTURE OF THE COLORADO 10 OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT;

(e) DEVELOP A PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP TO ENHANCE THE
 PROCUREMENT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; AND

(f) IF DEEMED NECESSARY BY THE MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE,
MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY REGARDING HOW
TO BEST ACHIEVE THE DESIRED RESULTS FOR THE FUTURE OF THE
PROCUREMENT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

17 (6) ALL STAFF NEEDED TO ASSIST THE TASK FORCE IN CONDUCTING
18 ITS DUTIES SHALL BE PROVIDED BY THE COLORADO OFFICE OF ECONOMIC
19 DEVELOPMENT.

20 (7) ALL <u>NONLEGISLATIVE</u> MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE SHALL
21 SERVE WITHOUT COMPENSATION. THIS SECTION SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED
22 TO PREVENT <u>NONLEGISLATIVE</u> MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE FROM
23 RECEIVING THEIR REGULAR SALARY IF THEY PARTICIPATE IN TASK FORCE
24 MEETINGS DURING THEIR REGULAR BUSINESS HOURS.

25 (8) THE LEGISLATIVE MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE SHALL BE
 26 COMPENSATED FOR ATTENDANCE AT MEETINGS OF THE TASK FORCE AND
 27 SHALL RECEIVE REIMBURSEMENT FOR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES

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<u>INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES AS MEMBERS OF THE</u>

Appropriation.** In addition to any other 26 appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the 27 general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the governor - lieutenant governor - state planning and budgeting for the fiscal year beginning July
 1, 2013, the sum of \$215,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
 for allocation to economic development programs for administrative
 support and procurement technical assistance related to the
 implementation of this act.
 SECTION 3. Appropriation. In addition to any other
