Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill changes the name of the office of health disparities in the department of public health and environment to the office of health equity (office) and adds duties to the office that include promoting health equity and including more diverse groups that may be affected by health equity and health disparity issues. The bill also replaces the minority health advisory commission with the health equity commission (commission). The purpose of the commission is to serve as an advisor to the office on health equity issues. The commission representation is changed from 13 to 15 members and includes the executive directors of the department of human services and department of health care policy and financing. The members of the commission must represent diverse populations in Colorado that include those whose health equity may be affected due to sexual orientation, gender identity, disability, ethnicity. and socioeconomic status and also must have expertise in at least one specified area. The commission's new duties include coordination of the departments' health equity efforts and health disparities grant program and strengthening partnerships with communities impacted by health disparities. The bill changes the sunset review date of the commission from 2017 to 2023.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-2201, amend
3	(2); and add (1.5) and (3) as follows:
4	25-4-2201. Legislative declaration. (1.5) THE GENERAL
5	ASSEMBLY HEREBY DETERMINES AND DECLARES THAT:
6	(a) UNDERSTANDING THE ROOT CAUSES OF HEALTH DISPARITIES
7	INCLUDES RECOGNIZING THAT HEALTH STARTS IN OUR HOMES, SCHOOLS,
8	AND COMMUNITIES;
9	(b) VULNERABLE POPULATIONS THAT ARE CURRENTLY IDENTIFIED
10	BY RACE, ETHNICITY, SEXUAL ORIENTATION, GENDER IDENTITY,
11	DISABILITY STATUS, AND SOCIOECONOMIC STATUS, AMONG OTHERS,
12	EXPERIENCE POORER HEALTH STATUS OUTCOMES; AND
13	(c) MOUNTING EVIDENCE DEMONSTRATES THAT FACTORS SUCH AS

ECONOMIC, PHYSICAL, AND SOCIAL ENVIRONMENT PLAY A SIGNIFICANT
 ROLE IN HEALTH, AND IF ADDRESSED, CAN CREATE BETTER HEALTH
 OUTCOMES.

4 (2) Therefore, the general assembly hereby declares that it is in the
5 best interests of the state to establish a health disparities grant program to
6 provide prevention, early detection, and treatment of cancer and
7 cardiovascular and pulmonary diseases to minority UNDER-REPRESENTED
8 populations.

9 (3) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS THAT MODIFYING THE DUTIES 10 AND STRUCTURE OF THE OFFICE OF HEALTH DISPARITIES TO BECOME THE 11 OFFICE OF HEALTH EQUITY REFLECTS THE RECENT ADVANCEMENTS IN THE 12 FIELD OF HEALTH BY BROADENING THE SCOPE OF THE OFFICE TO INCLUDE 13 THE ECONOMIC, PHYSICAL, AND SOCIAL ENVIRONMENT, AND OFFERS A 14 MORE INCLUSIVE APPROACH TO ELIMINATING HEALTH DISPARITIES FOR ALL 15 COLORADANS.

16 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-2202, amend
17 (1) and (4); repeal (2); and add (3.5), (3.7), and (4.5) as follows:

18 25-4-2202. Definitions. As used in this part 22, unless the
19 context otherwise requires:

20 (1) "Commission" means the minority health advisory HEALTH
 21 EQUITY commission created in section 25-4-2206.

(2) "Council" means the interagency health disparities leadership
 council created in section 25-4-2207.

24 (3.5) "HEALTH DISPARITIES" MEANS DIFFERENCES IN HEALTH
25 STATUS, ACCESS TO CARE, AND QUALITY OF CARE AS DETERMINED BY
26 RACE, ETHNICITY, SEXUAL ORIENTATION, GENDER IDENTITY, DISABILITY
27 STATUS, SOCIOECONOMIC STATUS, AND OTHER FACTORS.

(3.7) "HEALTH EQUITY" MEANS ACHIEVING THE HIGHEST LEVEL OF
 HEALTH FOR ALL PEOPLE AND ENTAILS FOCUSED EFFORTS TO ADDRESS
 AVOIDABLE INEQUALITIES BY EQUALIZING THOSE CONDITIONS FOR HEALTH
 FOR ALL GROUPS, ESPECIALLY FOR THOSE THAT HAVE EXPERIENCED
 SOCIOECONOMIC DISADVANTAGES OR HISTORICAL INJUSTICES.

6 (4) "Office" means the office of health disparities EQUITY created
7 in section 25-4-2204.

8 (4.5) "SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH" MEANS 9 LIFE-ENHANCING RESOURCES, SUCH AS FOOD, HOUSING, ECONOMIC AND 10 SOCIAL RELATIONSHIPS, TRANSPORTATION, EDUCATION, AND HEALTH 11 CARE, WHOSE DISTRIBUTION ACROSS POPULATIONS EFFECTIVELY 12 DETERMINES THE LENGTH AND QUALITY OF LIFE.

13 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-2203, amend
14 (3) as follows:

15 **25-4-2203.** Health disparity grant program - rules. (3) The 16 commission shall APPOINT A REVIEW COMMITTEE TO review the 17 applications received pursuant to this section and make recommendations 18 to the state board COMMISSION regarding the entities that may receive 19 grants and the amounts of the grants. THE COMMISSION SHALL FINALIZE 20 THE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FUNDING AND PROVIDE THEM TO THE STATE 21 BOARD. Within thirty days after receiving the commission's 22 recommendations, the state board shall award grants to the selected 23 entities, specifying the amount and duration of each award. A grant 24 awarded pursuant to this section shall not exceed three years without 25 renewal.

26 SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-2204, amend
27 (1) as follows:

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1 **25-4-2204. Office of health equity - creation.** (1) There is 2 hereby created in the department of public health and environment the 3 office of health disparities EQUITY. The executive director of the 4 department, subject to the provisions of section 13 of article XII of the 5 state constitution, shall appoint the director of the office, who shall be the 6 head of the office.

SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-2205, amend
(1), (2) introductory portion, (2) (b), (2) (d), (2) (e), (2) (j), and (3);
repeal (2) (k); and add (2) (l) and (2) (m) as follows:

10 25-4-2205. Powers and duties of office of health equity. 11 (1) The purpose of the office is to serve in a coordinating, educating, and 12 capacity-building role for state and local public health programs and 13 community-based organizations, The office shall be dedicated to 14 eliminating racial, ethnic, and rural health disparities in Colorado by 15 fostering systems change and capacity-building through collaboration 16 with multiple sectors impacting minority health and with input from a 17 variety of multicultural professionals PROMOTING HEALTH EQUITY IN 18 COLORADO BY IMPLEMENTING STRATEGIES TAILORED TO ADDRESS THE 19 VARYING COMPLEX CAUSES OF HEALTH DISPARITIES, INCLUDING THE 20 ECONOMIC, PHYSICAL, AND SOCIAL ENVIRONMENT. THE OFFICE SHALL 21 WORK COLLABORATIVELY WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT AND WITH AFFECTED 22 STAKEHOLDERS TO SET PRIORITIES, COLLECT AND DISSEMINATE DATA, AND 23 ALIGN RESOURCES WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT AND ACROSS OTHER STATE 24 AGENCIES.

25 (2) The office shall have HAS the following powers, duties, and
26 functions:

16	(3) The office shall report to the executive director of the
17	department or to the chief medical officer of the department HIS OR HER

19	SECTION 6. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-2206, amend
20	(1), (2) (a), (3) introductory portion, (3) (a), (3) (b), and (5); and repeal
21	(3) (c) as follows:
22	25-4-2206. Health equity commission - creation - repeal.
23	(1) There is hereby created in the office the minority health advisory
24	EQUITY commission. The purpose of the commission is to Provide a
25	formal mechanism for community members to raise awareness of
26	minority health needs, issues, and resources and to give input on health
27	programming at the level of the executive director of the department; help

1 the department determine culturally innovative data collection strategies; 2 and strengthen collaboration between the department and minority 3 communities to ensure that programs and services meet minority health 4 needs SERVE AS AN ADVISOR TO THE OFFICE ON HEALTH EQUITY ISSUES, 5 SPECIFICALLY FOCUSING ON ALIGNMENT, EDUCATION, AND 6 CAPACITY-BUILDING FOR STATE AND LOCAL HEALTH PROGRAMS AND 7 COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS. THE COMMISSION SHALL BE 8 DEDICATED TO PROMOTING HEALTH EQUITY AND ELIMINATING HEALTH 9 DISPARITIES.

(2) (a) The commission shall consist CONSISTS of the following
 thirteen FIFTEEN members, who shall be appointed ARE as follows:

(I) THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SHALL
APPOINT one member of the house of representatives; who shall be
appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;

(II) THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE SHALL APPOINT one member
of the senate; who shall be appointed by the president of the senate;

17 (III) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT SHALL 18 APPOINT ten members who represent, to the extent practical, Colorado's 19 DIVERSE ethnic, racial, SEXUAL ORIENTATION, GENDER IDENTITY, 20 DISABILITY, SOCIOECONOMIC, and geographic diversity appointed by the 21 executive director of the department. At a minimum, there shall be one 22 member who represents African Americans and Blacks in Colorado, one 23 member who represents Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in 24 Colorado, one member who represents native American Indians in 25 Colorado, and one member who represents Latinos and Hispanics in 26 Colorado; BACKGROUNDS. EACH PERSON APPOINTED TO THE COMMISSION 27 MUST HAVE DEMONSTRATED EXPERTISE IN AT LEAST ONE, AND

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1 PREFERABLY TWO, OF THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

2 (A) AFRICAN-AMERICAN, BLACK, ASIAN-AMERICAN, PACIFIC 3 ISLANDER, NATIVE AMERICAN, HISPANIC, LATINO, GAY, BISEXUAL, 4 TRANSGENDER, DISABLED, LOW SOCIOECONOMIC STATUS, AND 5 GEOGRAPHIC COMMUNITY HEALTH ISSUES; 6 (B) DATA COLLECTION, AGGREGATION, OR DISSEMINATION; 7 (C) EDUCATION; 8 (D) HOUSING; 9 (E) HEALTHY COMMUNITY DESIGN; 10 (F) COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT; 11 (G) LOCAL PUBLIC HEALTH; 12 (H) NONPROFITS, FOUNDATION, OR GRANT-MAKING; 13 (I) ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH; 14 (J) BEHAVIORAL HEALTH; OR 15 (K) THE PROVISION OF HEALTH CARE SERVICES. 16 (IV) The executive director of the department, OR HIS OR HER 17 DESIGNEE, shall serve as an ex officio member of the commission; 18 (V) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN 19 SERVICES, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE; AND (VI) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH 20 21 CARE POLICY AND FINANCING. OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE. 22 (3) The commission shall have HAS the following powers and 23 duties: 24 (a) Providing a formal mechanism for the public to give input to 25 the department at the level of the executive director of the department 26 OFFICE; 27 (b) Advising the executive director of the department and the

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department OFFICE on: determining culturally innovative data collection 2 strategies; 3 (I) DETERMINING INNOVATIVE DATA COLLECTION AND 4 DISSEMINATION STRATEGIES; 5 (II) ALIGNING THE DEPARTMENT'S HEALTH EQUITY EFFORTS AND 6 THE HEALTH DISPARITIES GRANT PROGRAM CREATED IN SECTION 7 25-4-2203: 8 (III) STRENGTHENING COLLABORATIVE PARTNERSHIPS WITH 9 COMMUNITIES IMPACTED BY HEALTH DISPARITIES TO IDENTIFY AND 10 PROMOTE HEALTH EQUITY STRATEGIES; AND 11 (IV) PROMOTING WORKFORCE DIVERSITY. 12 (c) Strengthening collaboration between the department and 13 minority communities; 14 (5) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2017 2023. 3 SECTION 9. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-1-119, amend
4 (11) as follows:

24-1-119. Department of public health and environment creation. (11) The office of health disparities EQUITY, created by section
25-4-2204, C.R.S., shall exercise its powers and perform its duties and
functions as if the same were transferred by a type 2 transfer to the
department of public health and environment.

10 **SECTION 10.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 11 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 12 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 13 7, 2013, if adjournment sine die is on May 8, 2013); except that, if a 14 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 15 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 16 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 17 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 18 November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 19 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
