A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING AN EXEMPTION WITHIN A ROUNDABOUT FROM THE RULE**

102 **REQUIRING A VEHICLE TO SIGNAL AN INTENTION TO LEAVE THE**

103 CURRENT LANE OF TRAVEL.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

Currently, a person must signal an intention to turn when intending to change lanes or turn while driving a vehicle. The bill exempts motor vehicles that are within a roundabout.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-1-102, add (85.5)
3	as follows:
4	42-1-102. Definitions. As used in articles 1 to 4 of this title,
5	unless the context otherwise requires:
6	(85.5) "Roundabout" means a circular intersection where
7	ROAD TRAFFIC IS SLOWED AND FLOWS IN ONE DIRECTION AROUND A
8	CENTRAL ISLAND TO EXIT ONTO ONE OF THE INTERSECTING ROADS.
9	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-903, amend (1),
10	(2), and (4) as follows:
11	42-4-903. Turning movements and required signals. (1) No A
12	person shall NOT turn a vehicle at an intersection unless the vehicle is in
13	proper position upon the roadway as required in section 42-4-901, or turn
14	a vehicle to enter a private road or driveway, or otherwise turn a vehicle
15	from a direct course or move right or left upon a roadway unless and until
16	such movement can be made with reasonable safety and then only after
17	giving an appropriate signal in the manner provided in sections 42-4-608
18	and 42-4-609; EXCEPT THAT A DRIVER NEED NOT USE A TURN SIGNAL, BUT
19	IS ENCOURAGED TO DO SO, WHEN TRAVELING IN A VEHICLE WITHIN A
20	ROUNDABOUT.
21	(2) A signal of intention to turn right or left PERSON shall be given
22	SIGNAL continuously during not less than the last one hundred feet
23	traveled by the vehicle before turning in urban or metropolitan areas and
24	shall be given OR continuously for at least two hundred feet on all
25	four-lane highways and other highways where the prima facie or posted

26 speed limit is more than forty miles per hour; Such signals shall be given

regardless of existing EXCEPT THAT A DRIVER NEED NOT USE A TURN
 <u>SIGNAL, BUT IS ENCOURAGED TO DO SO,</u> WHEN TRAVELING IN A VEHICLE
 WITHIN A ROUNDABOUT. Weather conditions DO NOT CHANGE THE SIGNAL
 REQUIREMENTS.

5 (4) A PERSON SHALL USE the signals provided for in section
6 42-4-608 (2) shall be used to indicate an intention to turn, change lanes,
7 or start from a parked position; and EXCEPT THAT:

8 (a) A PERSON shall not be flashed FLASH on one side only on a
9 parked or disabled vehicle or flashed as a courtesy or "do pass" signal to
10 operators of other vehicles approaching from the rear; AND

(b) A DRIVER NEED NOT USE A TURN <u>SIGNAL, BUT IS ENCOURAGED</u>
 <u>TO DO SO</u>, WHEN TRAVELING IN A VEHICLE WITHIN A ROUNDABOUT.

13 **SECTION 3.** Act subject to petition - effective date -14 **applicability.** (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following 15 the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the 16 general assembly (August 7, 2013, if adjournment sine die is on May 8, 17 2013); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 18 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, 19 or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part 20 will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election 21 to be held in November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the 22 date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

23 (2) This act applies to acts committed on or after the applicable24 effective date of this act.
