A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE CREATION OF A STATEWIDE YOUTH DEVELOPMENT**
102 **PLAN, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN**
103 **APPROPRIATION.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill directs the Tony Grampas youth services board to convene, subject to available funding, a group of interested parties to create a statewide youth development plan and a baseline measurement of youth activities, based on available data and resources.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly
3 hereby finds and declares that in 2011 alone:

4 (a) Fifteen and a half percent of high school students in Colorado
5 carried a weapon to school in the previous thirty days;

6 (b) There were more than thirty-four thousand juvenile arrests in
7 Colorado;

8 (c) Four hundred thirty-one juveniles were arrested for weapons
9 violations, and more than thirty-five hundred juveniles were arrested for
10 drug violations;

11 (d) Nearly twenty-five percent of high school students in Colorado
12 were involved in fights during the previous year; and

13 (e) Sixty-seven thousand young people in Colorado ages eighteen
14 to twenty-four were unemployed, not attending school, and had no degree
15 beyond a high school diploma.

16 (2) The general assembly also finds that the Tony Grampsas youth
17 services program was established in 1994 to provide statewide funding
18 for community-based programs that target youth and their families for
19 intervention services in an effort to reduce incidents of youth crime and
20 violence. Further, the Tony Grampsas youth services program was
21 established to promote prevention and education programs that are
22 designed to reduce the occurrence and reoccurrence of child abuse and
23 neglect and to reduce the need for state intervention in those cases.

24 (3) Therefore, the general assembly declares that it is in the best
25 interests of the people of Colorado to develop a comprehensive state plan
26 for youth development in order to quantify existing and needed services

1 and to align existing limited resources to help promote positive youth
2 development.

3 (4) The general assembly further finds that it is in the best interest
4 of the people of Colorado for the department of human services to
5 coordinate prevention and intervention programs and to oversee the
6 provision of these services to ensure collaboration among communities
7 and programs, with the goal of ensuring the availability of a continuum
8 of services for youth.

9 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 26-1-111.3 as
10 follows:

11 **26-1-111.3. Activities of the state department under the**
12 **supervision of the executive director - Colorado state youth**
13 **development plan - creation - definitions.** (1) (a) SUBJECT TO
14 AVAILABLE FUNDING, THE STATE DEPARTMENT, IN COLLABORATION WITH
15 THE TONY GRAMPSAS YOUTH SERVICES BOARD, CREATED IN SECTION
16 26-6.8-103, SHALL CONVENE A GROUP OF INTERESTED PARTIES TO CREATE
17 A COLORADO STATE YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PLAN. THE GOALS OF THE PLAN
18 ARE TO IDENTIFY KEY ISSUES AFFECTING YOUTH AND ALIGN STRATEGIC
19 EFFORTS TO ACHIEVE POSITIVE OUTCOMES FOR ALL YOUTH.

20 (b) THE PLAN MUST:

21 (I) IDENTIFY INITIATIVES AND STRATEGIES, ORGANIZATIONS, AND
22 GAPS IN COVERAGE THAT IMPACT YOUTH DEVELOPMENT OUTCOMES;

23 (II) IDENTIFY SERVICES, FUNDING, AND PARTNERSHIPS NECESSARY
24 TO ENSURE THAT YOUTH HAVE THE MEANS AND THE SOCIAL AND
25 EMOTIONAL SKILLS TO SUCCESSFULLY TRANSITION INTO ADULTHOOD;

26 (III) DETERMINE WHAT IS NECESSARY IN TERMS OF COMMUNITY
27 INVOLVEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT TO ENSURE YOUTH SUCCEED;

1 (IV) DEVELOP AN OUTLINE OF YOUTH SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS
2 BASED ON, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DEMOGRAPHICS, CURRENT SERVICES AND
3 CAPACITY, AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT;

4 (V) IDENTIFY SUCCESSFUL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT STRATEGIES
5 NATIONALLY AND IN COLORADO THAT COULD BE REPLICATED BY
6 COMMUNITY PARTNERS AND ENTITIES ACROSS THE STATE; AND

7 (VI) CREATE A SHARED VISION FOR HOW A STRONG YOUTH
8 DEVELOPMENT NETWORK WOULD BE SHAPED AND MEASURED.

9 (c) THE PLAN MUST INCLUDE A BASELINE MEASUREMENT OF YOUTH
10 ACTIVITIES, DEVELOPED USING AVAILABLE DATA AND RESOURCES. DATA
11 AND RESOURCES MAY BE COLLECTED FROM, BUT NEED NOT BE LIMITED TO,
12 THE FOLLOWING:

13 (I) AN EXISTING YOUTH RISK BEHAVIOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM
14 THAT MONITORS HEALTH-RISK BEHAVIORS THAT CONTRIBUTE TO THE
15 LEADING CAUSES OF DEATH AND DISABILITY AMONG YOUTH, INCLUDING:

16 (A) BEHAVIORS THAT CONTRIBUTE TO UNINTENTIONAL INJURIES
17 AND VIOLENCE;

18 (B) SEXUAL BEHAVIORS THAT CONTRIBUTE TO UNINTENDED
19 PREGNANCY AND SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS, INCLUDING HIV;

20 (C) ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUG USE;

21 (D) TOBACCO USE;

22 (E) UNHEALTHY DIETARY BEHAVIORS; AND

23 (F) INADEQUATE PHYSICAL ACTIVITY;

24 (II) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION;

25 (III) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHER EDUCATION, TO ASSESS
26 WORKFORCE READINESS AND STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AS YOUTH
27 TRANSITION THROUGH THE SECONDARY AND POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION

1 SYSTEMS;

2 (IV) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND

3 ENVIRONMENT;

4 (V) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CARE POLICY AND

5 FINANCING;

6 (VI) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES;

7 (VII) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT;

8 (VIII) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY; AND

9 (IX) THE STATE JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

10 (2) THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY

11 COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE PLAN AND IS NOT

12 REQUIRED TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION UNTIL ADEQUATE FUNDING IS

13 SECURED.

14 (3) THE STATE DEPARTMENT, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE TONY

16 SHALL COMPLETE THE PLAN ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30, 2014, AND

13 **SECTION 13. Appropriation.** In addition to any other
14 appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the
15 general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the department of public
16 health and environment, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, the
17 sum of \$300,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for allocation
18 to the Tony Grampsas youth services program, for grants to organizations
19 seeking independent certification as evidence-based programs.

20 **SECTION 14. Effective date.** (1) Except as otherwise provided
21 in this section, this act takes effect July 1, 2013.

22 (2) Sections 2 and 3, 5 to 9, and 12 of this act take effect only if
23 House Bill 13-1117 becomes law and take effect either upon the effective
24 date of this act or House Bill 13-1117, whichever is later.

26 Bill 13-1117 does not become law.

27 **SECTION 15. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
