Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill directs the Tony Grampsas youth services board to convene, subject to available funding, a group of interested parties to create a statewide youth development plan and a baseline measurement of youth activities, based on available data and resources.

| 8 | (c) Four hundred thirty-one juveniles were arrested for weapons |
| 9 | violations, and more than thirty-five hundred juveniles were arrested for |
| 10 | drug violations; |
| 11 | (d) Nearly twenty-five percent of high school students in Colorado |
| 12 | were involved in fights during the previous year; and |
| 13 | (e) Sixty-seven thousand young people in Colorado ages eighteen |
| 14 | to twenty-four were unemployed, not attending school, and had no degree |
| 15 | beyond a high school diploma. |
| 16 | (2) The general assembly also finds that the Tony Grampsas youth |
| 17 | services program was established in 1994 to provide statewide funding |
| 18 | for community-based programs that target youth and their families for |
| 19 | intervention services in an effort to reduce incidents of youth crime and |
| 20 | violence. Further, the Tony Grampsas youth services program was |
| 21 | established to promote prevention and education programs that are |
| 22 | designed to reduce the occurrence and reoccurrence of child abuse and |
| 23 | neglect and to reduce the need for state intervention in those cases. |
| 24 | (3) Therefore, the general assembly declares that it is in the best |

In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-20.5-201, 13 **amend** (2) (a) and (2) (b) as follows: 14 Tony Grampsas youth services program -25-20.5-201. 15 creation - standards - applications. (2) (a) The Tony Grampsas youth 16 services program shall be administered through the division. Subject to 17 the designation in paragraph (b) of this subsection (2), The Tony 18 Grampsas youth services board created in section 25-20.5-202 shall 19 choose those entities that will receive grants through the Tony Grampsas 20 youth services program and the amount of each grant. In addition, the 21 division shall monitor the effectiveness of programs that receive funds 22 through the Tony Grampsas youth services program. 23 (b) Any grant awarded through the Tony Grampsas youth services 24 program shall be paid from moneys appropriated pursuant to paragraph (c) of this subsection (2) or out of the general fund for such program. 25 26 Each year, no less than twenty percent of the appropriation shall be 27 designated and used exclusively for programs designed for children 1 younger than nine years of age. The board, in accordance with the 2 timelines adopted pursuant to section 25-20.5-202 (3), shall submit a list 3 of the entities chosen to receive grants to the governor for approval. The 4 governor shall either approve or disapprove the entire list of entities by 5 responding to the board within twenty days. If the governor has not responded to the board within twenty days after receipt of the list, the list 6 7 shall be deemed approved. No grants shall be awarded through the Tony 8 Grampsas youth services program without the prior approval of the 9 governor.

SECTION 12. Appropriation. In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the department of human services, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, the sum of \$300,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for allocation to the Tony Grampsas youth services program, for grants to organizations seeking independent certification as evidence-based programs.

SECTION 13. Appropriation. In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the department of public health and environment, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, the sum of \$300,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for allocation to the Tony Grampsas youth services program, for grants to organizations seeking independent certification as evidence-based programs.
