#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE ABILITY OF A PEACE OFFICER TO OBTAIN AN ALCOHOL BEVERAGE LICENSE.

#### **Bill Summary**

Current law prohibits a peace officer from obtaining an alcohol beverage license issued under the "Colorado Liquor Code". The bill repeals this prohibition.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-47-307, amend

4	12-47-307. Persons prohibited as licensees. (2) (a) No license
5	provided by this article shall be issued to or held by any A peace officer
6	DESCRIBED IN SECTION 16-2.5-121, 16-2.5-122, 16-2.5-123, 16-2.5-125,
7	16-2.5-126, 16-2.5-128, OR 16-2.5-129, C.R.S., or the state licensing
8	authority or any of its inspectors or employees.
9	(b) A PEACE OFFICER DESCRIBED IN SECTION 16-2.5-103,
10	16-2.5-105, 16-2.5-108, 16-2.5-132, OR 16-2.5-149, C.R.S., MAY NOT
11	OBTAIN OR HOLD A LICENSE UNDER THIS ARTICLE TO OPERATE A LICENSED
12	PREMISES THAT IS LOCATED WITHIN THE SAME JURISDICTION THAT
13	EMPLOYS THE PEACE OFFICER.
14	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
15	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
16	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
17	7, 2013, if adjournment sine die is on May 8, 2013); except that, if a
18	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
19	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
20	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
21	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
22	November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
23	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
