### **Summary of Legislation**

This bill changes the name of the Interagency Task Force on Drunk Driving (ITFDD) to the "Colorado Task Force on Drunk and Impaired Driving," and modifies the membership of the task force. Specifically, the bill requires that the following new members be appointed:

- a representative of a statewide organization that represents persons who are licensed to sell retail marijuana for consumption off-premises:
- the director of the Peace Officers Standards and Training Board, or a designee; and
- two representatives appointed by the director of the Division of Behavioral Health in the Department of Human Services — one who is an expert in substance abuse education and treatment for offenders who drive under the influence or while ability impaired, and one who has expertise in providing minors, adolescents, and juvenile offenders with substance abuse treatment and related services.

The bill removes the director of the Division of Behavioral Health in the Department of Human Services from the task force.

# Background

The ITFDD was created in law by the General Assembly in 2006 to investigate the methods for reducing the occurrence of drunk and impaired driving, and to make recommendations to the state regarding the enhancement of government services, education, and intervention to prevent drunk and impaired driving.

## **State Expenditures**

This bill may increase the workload of the Peace Officers Standards and Training Board in the Department of Law, the Department of Human Services, and the Department of Transportation for staff time devoted to serving on the task force and appointing members. Staff time expended on the task force can be absorbed within existing resources. Task force members serve without compensation or reimbursement for expenses.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect August 6, 2014, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 7, 2014, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
