Summary of Legislation

The bill adds great-grandparents to the statutory provisions governing the visitation rights of grandparents and disputes concerning grandparent visitation.

State Expenditures

The bill may result in a minimal increase in workload in the Judicial Branch from additional cases filed by great-grandparents involved in disputes about visitation. Given that less than 10 cases are filed per year concerning grandparent visitation under current law, the addition of great-grandparents will have a minimal impact on trial court caseload. No changes in appropriations are required.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect September 1, 2014, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
