Summary of Legislation

Under current law, a school district board of education (school board) may compensate the board's secretary, assistant secretary, treasurer, and assistant treasurer, but may not compensate the board's president or vice-president. All school board officers may be reimbursed from the board's budget for necessary expenses incurred in performing his or her official duties. This bill removes the restriction against compensating the president and vice-president of a school board.

School District Impact

The bill adds a school board's president and vice-president to the list of those who may receive compensation for services performed on a school board, but does not require a school board to compensate any position for its service. The fiscal note assumes that no school board currently pays its board members, except for the position of secretary which generally receives a stipend or payment. The bill will impact school board expenditures to the extent that school boards elect to compensate their members.

Pursuant to Section 22-32-143, C.R.S., school districts and Boards of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) may submit estimates of fiscal impacts within seven days of a bill's introduction. As of the date of this fiscal note, no summaries of fiscal impacts were submitted by districts or BOCES for this bill. Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 6, 2014, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 7, 2014, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
