A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING DISTRICT COMMISSIONS ON JUDICIAL PERFORMANCE.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Current law directs district commissions on judicial performance (commissions), as part of their evaluations of district and county judges, to interview other district and county judges and other interested persons. The bill adds to this list the district attorney, a representative of the state public defender, and a representative of the local bar association.

The commission must issue invitations to the new interviewees not less than 35 days before the interview. A majority of the commission

must be present at the interview. The commission may substitute a written submission in place of an interview only with the consent of the invited person.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 13-5.5-105, **amend**
3 (1) (d); and **add** (4) as follows:

4 **13-5.5-105. Powers and duties of district commissions.** (1) In
5 addition to other powers conferred and duties imposed upon a district
6 commission by this article, in conformity with the rules, guidelines, and
7 procedures adopted by the state commission pursuant to section
8 13-5.5-103 (1) (f) and the state commission's review of the deliberation
9 procedures pursuant to section 13-5.5-103 (1) (p), a district commission
10 has the following powers and duties:

11 (d) To interview district and county court judges, A
12 REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY, A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE
13 STATE PUBLIC DEFENDER, A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE LOCAL BAR
14 ASSOCIATION, and other persons and accept information and
15 documentation from interested persons;

17 (4) BEFORE SUBMITTING THE NARRATIVES, A DISTRICT
18 COMMISSION SHALL INVITE A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DISTRICT
19 ATTORNEY, A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE STATE PUBLIC DEFENDER, AND A
20 REPRESENTATIVE OF THE LOCAL BAR ASSOCIATION TO PARTICIPATE
21 INDIVIDUALLY IN THE INTERVIEW REQUIRED BY PARAGRAPH (d) OF
22 SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION. THE INVITED PARTY MAY ATTEND OR
23 DESIGNATE A REPRESENTATIVE TO ATTEND THE INTERVIEW. THE DISTRICT
24 COMMISSION MUST ISSUE THE INVITATION NOT LESS THAN THIRTY-FIVE

1 DAYS BEFORE THE SCHEDULED INTERVIEW. A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS
2 OF THE DISTRICT COMMISSION MUST BE PRESENT AT EACH INTERVIEW. THE
3 DISTRICT COMMISSION SHALL NOT SUBSTITUTE A WRITTEN SUBMISSION FOR
4 THE INTERVIEW WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE INVITED PARTY.

5 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
6 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
7 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
