Summary of Legislation

Under current law, when a local governing body conducts an executive session, the minutes of the session must identify the topics discussed. This bill requires that when a local board of education conducts an executive session, the minutes must also reflect the amount of time each topic was discussed. Those minutes, along with the time log of the topics discussed, must be posted on the school board's website within ten business days following the meeting at which the minutes are approved by the board. If the board does not maintain a website, the minutes must be published in the same manner as the board regularly provides public notice. Finally, this bill requires that electronic recordings of an executive session be retained for at least two calendar years.

School District Impact

Local boards of education must adjust internal practices related to recording executive sessions and implementing open meeting laws, and will have new expenses to create and implement procedures for logging and recording executive sessions.

Under current law, school districts and Boards of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) may submit estimates of fiscal impacts within seven days of a bill's introduction. As of the date of this fiscal note, no summaries of fiscal impacts were submitted by districts or BOCES for this bill. Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature, and applies to meetings of local boards of education that take place on or after this effective date.
