## **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

#### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment J.001 (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$3.5 million General Fund to the Public Safety Communications Trust Fund for both FY 2013-14 and FY 2014-15. These moneys are further appropriated to the Governor's Office of Information Technology for the replacement of legacy radio equipment and hardware at Digital Trunked Radio System (DTRS) tower sites.

#### **Points to Consider**

#### General Fund Impact

1. The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) has proposed a supplemental budget package for FY 2013-14 based on the December 2013 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. The supplemental budget package allocates all but approximately \$0.7 million of General Fund revenues projected to be available; under current law, this \$0.7 million will be

transferred to the Colorado Water Conservation Board Construction Fund. The JBC has included as part of its FY 2013-14 supplemental budget package a \$3,500,000 General Fund appropriation for implementation of this bill.

2. The general appropriations bill for FY 2014-15 has not yet been introduced. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$3,500,000 for FY 2014-15, reducing the amount of General Fund available for other existing programs.
