A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE EXEMPTION OF AUTOCYCLES FROM REGULATION AS MOTORCYCLES, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, DEFINING AUTOCYCLE, EXEMPTING AUTOCYCLES FROM MOTORCYCLE STATUTES, AND REQUIRING AUTOCYCLES BE ISSUED LICENSE PLATES SIMILAR TO MOTORCYCLE LICENSE PLATES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Currently, most self-propelled 3-wheel vehicles may be considered

motorcycles under the "Uniform Motor Vehicle Law". This means, among other things, that a driver must have a motorcycle endorsement on the driver's license and wear a helmet. Autocycles are self-propelled 3-wheeled vehicles that have safety belts and air bags and are completely enclosed. The bill clarifies that the definition of "motorcycle" does not include autocycles. This means that motorcycle-specific rules don't apply to an autocycle driver. But autocycles are issued license plates that are similar to motorcycle plates.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-1-102, amend
3	(55); and add (7.5) as follows:
4	42-1-102. Definitions. As used in articles 1 to 4 of this title,
5	unless the context otherwise requires:
6	(7.5) "AUTOCYCLE" MEANS A THREE-WHEELED MOTOR VEHICLE IN
7	WHICH THE DRIVER AND EACH PASSENGER RIDES IN AN ENCLOSED SEATING
8	AREA THAT IS EQUIPPED WITH:
9	(a) SAFETY BELTS FOR ALL OCCUPANTS THAT COMPLY WITH
10	SECTION 42-4-237;
11	(b) AIRBAG PROTECTION; AND
12	(c) A HARDTOP ENCLOSURE THAT PROTECTS OCCUPANTS FROM THE
13	ELEMENTS AND THAT SUPPORTS THE VEHICLE'S WEIGHT WITHOUT
14	HARMING THE OCCUPANTS WHEN THE VEHICLE IS RESTING ON THE
15	ENCLOSURE.
16	(55) "Motorcycle" means a motor vehicle that uses handlebars or
17	any other device connected to the front wheel to steer and that is designed
18	to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground; except
19	that the term does not include a farm tractor, AUTOCYCLE, low-speed
20	electric vehicle, or low-power scooter.
21	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-3-201, amend (1)

1	(a) (I) (D) and (1) (a) (I) (E); and add (1) (a) (I) (F) as follows:
2	42-3-201. Number plates furnished - style - periodic reissuance
3	- tabs - rules. (1) (a) (I) The department shall issue to every owner
4	whose vehicle is registered two number plates; except that the department
5	shall issue one number plate for the following:
6	(D) A vehicle drawn by a motor vehicle; or
7	(E) An item of special mobile machinery; OR
8	(F) AN AUTOCYCLE.
9	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-3-202, amend (1)
10	(a) as follows:
11	42-3-202. Number plates to be attached. (1) (a) The OWNER
12	SHALL ATTACH THE number plates assigned to a self-propelled vehicle,
13	other than a motorcycle, AUTOCYCLE, or street rod vehicle, shall be
14	attached thereto, TO THE VEHICLE WITH one in the front and the other in
15	the rear. The OWNER SHALL ATTACH THE number plate assigned to a
16	motorcycle, AUTOCYCLE, street rod vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, other
17	vehicle drawn by a motor vehicle, or special mobile machinery shall be
18	attached to the rear thereof OF THE VEHICLE. THE OWNER SHALL DISPLAY
19	number plates shall be so displayed during the current registration year,
20	except as otherwise provided in this article.
21	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-3-203, amend (1)
22	as follows:
23	42-3-203. Standardized plates - rules. (1) (a) Unless otherwise
24	authorized by statute, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE all Class C vehicles
25	shall be issued a single type of standardized license plate. Unless
26	otherwise authorized by statute, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE all Class
27	B vehicles, except recreational trucks, shall be issued a single type of

2	(b) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE A REGISTERED AUTOCYCLE A
3	LICENSE PLATE THAT:
4	(I) IS THE SAME SIZE AS A MOTORCYCLE LICENSE PLATE; AND
5	(II) DISPLAYS THE REGISTRATION NUMBER IN NUMERALS OF
6	LETTERS OF AT LEAST ONE-AND-ONE-HALF INCHES IN HEIGHT.
7	SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-6-102, amend
8	(12) as follows:
9	12-6-102. Definitions. As used in this part 1 and in part 5 of this
10	article, unless the context or section 12-6-502 otherwise requires:
11	(12) "Motor vehicle" means every vehicle intended primarily for
12	use and operation on the public highways which THAT is self-propelled
13	and every vehicle intended primarily for operation on the public highways
14	which THAT is not driven or propelled by its own power but which is
15	designed to be attached to or become a part of or to be drawn by a
16	self-propelled vehicle, not including farm tractors and other machines and
17	tools used in the production, harvesting, and care of farm products
18	"Motor vehicle" includes, without limitation, a low-power scooter OR
19	AUTOCYCLE as EITHER IS defined in section 42-1-102, C.R.S.
20	SECTION 6. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
21	takes effect July 1, 2015; except that, if a referendum petition is filed
22	pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this
23	act or an item, section, or part of this act within the ninety-day period
24	after final adjournment of the general assembly, then the act, item
25	section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the
26	general election to be held in November 2014 and, in such case, will take
