Summary of Legislation

The bill allows the state treasurer to loan gifts to the governor to the state historical society (History Colorado) for display at state museums and similar institutions.

Background

Under current law, the governor is not allowed to accept gifts valued over a certain amount that he or she receives in the course of executing his or her official duties. Such gifts may be accepted by the state treasurer on behalf of the state with approval of the governor and may be disposed of by the General Assembly. Typically, these gift items are held indefinitely by the state treasurer.

State Expenditures

This bill creates an additional option for handling gifts received by the governor by allowing such items to be publicly displayed at state museums. History Colorado, a division of the Department of Higher Education, may have additional costs and workload to store, prepare, and display gift items loaned from the state treasurer. Acceptance of such items is at the discretion of History Colorado and costs will only be incurred if it chooses to accept and display such items. No change in appropriations are required at this time.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 6, 2014, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 7, 2014, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
