A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE ISSUANCE OF IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENTS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

Joint Budget Committee. The bill eliminates the identification security fund and the motorist insurance identification account in the highway users tax fund and allocates the moneys previously allocated to those funds to the licensing services cash fund and the Colorado state

titling and registration account. An additional fee is imposed by the department of revenue on the issuance of a driver's license for each time an applicant retakes either the written exam or the driving exam.

The department is authorized to change statutory fees concerning driver's licenses and identification cards, but the fees cannot increase by more than 20% the first year and 5% per year thereafter and the joint budget committee must be notified before fees are increased.

Some people may not have the ability to provide the documents necessary to get a driver's license or identification card. A process, known as exceptions processing, allows people to use alternative documents and evidence. The department is required to operate at least 4 regional offices that allow exceptions processing.

The bill requires that any unexpended moneys in the Colorado state titling and registration account at the end of each fiscal year remain in the fund.

The bill also modifies the allocation of the driver's license restoration fee. Currently, \$60 of this fee is credited to the administrative revocation account in the highway users tax fund and \$35 is credited to the first time drunk driving offender account in the highway users tax fund. The bill changes this allocation by crediting \$73 to the administrative revocation account and \$22 to the first time drunk driving offender account.

Finally, people may renew driver's licenses and identification cards electronically for 2 consecutive renewal periods.
