#### Fiscal Impact of Bill as Amended to Date

The most recent Legislative Council Staff Revised Fiscal Note (attached) reflects the fiscal impact of the bill as of 03/27/14.

The Legislative Council Staff Revised Fiscal Note dated 03/27/14 assumed that the actuarial services required to implement the bill would received a 51 percent federal match rate, but because these are administrative costs they actually qualify for only a 50 percent federal match rate. This does not change the total projected cost of the bill of \$51,133, but it slightly changes the proportion of costs paid from each fund source to \$16,533 General Fund and \$34,600 federal funds. Legislative Council Staff agrees with this technical correction to the fund sources.

### **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing for FY 2014-15 a total of \$51,133, including \$16,533 General Fund and \$34,600 federal funds. Pursuant to direction from the Chairmen of the Appropriations Committees, this amendment includes a provision to access the \$20.0 million General Fund that has been set aside in the Joint Budget Committee's FY 2014-15 budget package to fund 2014 legislation.

# **Points to Consider**

# General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2014-15 based on the March 2014 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. The budget package allocates \$20.0 million General Fund to be available to fund 2014 legislation; if the full \$20.0 million is not used to fund legislation, it will be credited to the Controlled Maintenance Trust Fund.
