Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision reducing General Fund appropriations by \$77,000 for FY 2014-15. Pursuant to direction from the Chairmen of the Appropriations Committees, this amendment includes a provision to access the \$20.0 million General Fund that has been set aside in the Joint Budget Committee's FY 2014-15 budget package to fund 2014 legislation. For FY 2014-15, this amendment accesses set-aside moneys to offset the FY 2014-15 General Fund revenue reduction of \$77,000.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2014-15 based on the March 2014 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. The budget package allocates \$20.0

million General Fund to be available to fund 2014 legislation; if the full \$20.0 million is not used to fund legislation, it will be credited to the Controlled Maintenance Trust Fund.
