A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE COLORADO DENTAL HEALTH CARE PROGRAM FOR LOW-INCOME SENIORS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

There is currently a program in the department of public health and environment to provide dental services to eligible, low-income seniors. The bill moves the program to the department of health care policy and financing (department). The bill directs the department to make grants to area agencies on aging or other grantees designated by an area agency on

aging to arrange for dental services for eligible seniors. The bill directs the medical services board (board) to promulgate rules governing the program including itemizing dental services to be covered and maximum fees to be charged for such services. The bill establishes a senior dental advisory committee to make recommendations to the department and the board.
