The concurrent resolution protects people's electronic data from unreasonable searches and seizures.

 of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:
 SECTION 1. At the next election at which such question may be
 submitted, there shall be submitted to the registered electors of the state
 of Colorado, for their approval or rejection, the following amendment to
 the constitution of the state of Colorado, to wit:

7 In the constitution of the state of Colorado, amend section 7 of8 article II as follows:

9 Section 7. Security of person and property - searches -10 seizures - warrants. The people shall be secure in their persons, papers, 11 homes, ELECTRONIC DATA, and OTHER effects, from unreasonable 12 searches and seizures; and no warrant to search any place or seize any 13 person or things shall issue without describing the place to be searched, 14 or the person or thing to be seized, as near as may be, nor without 15 probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation reduced to writing.

SECTION 2. Each elector voting at said election and desirous of
voting for or against said amendment shall cast a vote as provided by law
either "Yes/For" or "No/Against" on the proposition: "Shall there be an
amendment to the Colorado constitution concerning the protection of
electronic data from unreasonable searches and seizures?"

SECTION 3. The votes cast for the adoption or rejection of said amendment shall be canvassed and the result determined in the manner provided by law for the canvassing of votes for representatives in Congress, and if a majority of the electors voting on the question shall
