101	CONCERNING ADJUSTMENTS IN THE AMOUNT OF TOTAL PROGRAM
102	FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR THE 2013-14 BUDGET YEAR,
103	AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

Joint Budget Committee. The general assembly recognizes that increases in the funded pupil count have increased the amount required for total program funding for the 2013-14 budget year. Decreases in the amount of property tax and specific ownership tax revenues available to

HOUSE 2nd Reading Unamended February 10, 2014 school districts have also increased the amount of the state share for total program funding for the 2013-14 budget year. Based on these circumstances, the bill increases the minimum level of total program funding for the 2013-14 budget year.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly 3 hereby finds and declares that: 4 (a) Based on the actual funded pupil count for the 2013-14 budget 5 year, total program funding is sixteen million nine hundred ninety-five 6 thousand three hundred sixteen dollars higher than anticipated when the 7 general assembly appropriated moneys for total program funding for the 8 2013-14 budget year during the 2013 regular legislative session; 9 (b) Based on the actual amount of local property tax revenues and 10 specific ownership tax revenues available to school districts for the 11 2013-14 budget year, the local share of total program funding is thirty-six 12 million eight hundred eighty-nine thousand eight hundred seventy dollars 13 lower than anticipated when the general assembly appropriated moneys 14 for total program funding for the 2013-14 budget year during the 2013 15 regular legislative session; and 16 (c) It is the intent of the general assembly that the amount of total 17 program funding for the 2013-14 budget year, after application of the 18 negative factor described in section 22-54-104 (5) (g), Colorado Revised 19 Statutes, be adjusted to provide additional funding associated with the 20 lower-than-anticipated property tax and specific ownership tax revenues 21 and the unanticipated increase in the funded pupil count for the 2013-14 22 budget year. 23 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-54-104, amend

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(5) (g) (I) (D) as follows:

22-54-104. District total program. (5) For purposes of the formulas used in this section:

- (g) (I) For the 2010-11 budget year and each budget year thereafter, the general assembly determines that stabilization of the state budget requires a reduction in the amount of the annual appropriation to fund the state's share of total program funding for all districts and the funding for institute charter schools. The department of education shall implement the reduction in total program funding through the application of a negative factor as provided in this paragraph (g). For the 2010-11 budget year and each budget year thereafter, the department of education and the staff of the legislative council shall determine, based on budget projections, the amount of such reduction to ensure the following:
- (D) That, for the 2013-14 budget year, and each budget year thereafter, the sum of the total program funding for all districts, including the funding for institute charter schools, after application of the negative factor, is not less than five billion five hundred five TWENTY-FOUR million three hundred thirty-two FORTY-SIX thousand twenty-four SEVEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN dollars (\$5,505,332,024) (\$5,524,046,767); except that the department of education and the staff of the legislative council shall make mid-year revisions to replace projections with actual figures including, but not limited to, actual pupil enrollment, assessed valuations, and specific ownership tax revenue from the prior year, to determine any necessary changes in the amount of the reduction to maintain a total program funding amount for the applicable budget year that is consistent with this sub-subparagraph (D).

SECTION 3. Appropriation. In addition to any other

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1 appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, to the department of 2 education, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, the sum of 3 \$55,437,495, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for allocation to 4 public school finance for the state share of districts' total program 5 funding. Of said sum, \$51,637,093 is from the general fund, and 6 \$3,800,402 is from the state education fund created in section 17 (4) (a) 7 of article IX of the state constitution. 8 SECTION 4. Appropriation to the department of education 9 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013. In Session Laws of Colorado 10 2013, section 2 of chapter 441, (SB 13-230), **amend** Part III (2) (A) 11 Footnote 4, as amended by section 15 of chapter 236 (SB13-260), Session 12 Laws of Colorado 2013, as follows: 13 Section 2. Appropriation. 14 4 Department of Education, Assistance to Public Schools, Public 15 School Finance, State Share of Districts' Total Program Funding 16 -- Pursuant to Section 22-35-108 (2) (a), C.R.S., the purpose of 17 this footnote is to specify what portion of this appropriation is 18 intended to be available for the Accelerating Students Through 19 Concurrent Enrollment (ASCENT) Program for FY 2013-14. It is 20 the intent of the General Assembly that the Department of 21 Education be authorized to utilize up to \$2,727,900 \$2,371,507 of 22 this appropriation to fund qualified students designated as 23 ASCENT Program participants. This amount is calculated based 24 on an estimated 450 390.5 FTE participants funded at a rate of 25 \$6,062 \$6,073 per FTE pursuant to Section 22-54-104 (4.7), 26 C.R.S.

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SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
