A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING CONSERVANCY DISTRICTS THAT ARE ORGANIZED FOR

102 THE PURPOSE OF PREVENTING FLOODS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Conservancy districts may be formed by a local election to reduce flood risk, conserve or develop water resources, or participate in the development of parks or recreational facilities. **Section 1** of the bill clarifies that when a director no longer resides within a conservancy district, a vacancy is created on the district's board of directors.

The remainder of the bill applies only to the Pueblo conservancy district. **Section 1** increases the board of directors from 3 to 7 directors, makes the existing 3 directors at-large representatives, and specifies that the 4 new directors represent, respectively, the Colorado city metropolitan district (whose initial term is 2 years), the city of Pueblo (whose initial term is 3 years), the Pueblo West metropolitan district (whose initial term is 4 years), and those portions of Pueblo county not already represented (who serves a full 5-year term). All new vacancies must be filled by election rather than appointment by a district court judge.

Section 2 specifies that the Pueblo conservancy district may spend district revenues, including from its construction and maintenance funds, for the following purposes, in the following order of priority:

- ! First, for the maintenance, repair, replacement, or improvement of the district's existing flood control levees;
- ! Second, for flood mitigation projects located in whole or part within the district, whether capital or otherwise, in the affected watershed upstream of the district's existing flood control levees; and
- ! Third, for flood mitigation projects located in whole or part within the district, whether capital or otherwise, in the affected watershed downstream of the district's existing flood control levees.

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 37-3-101 as

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37-3-101. Appointment or election of directors. (1) (a) EXCEPT

5 AS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION:

6 (I) Within thirty days after entering the decree incorporating said 7 THE district, the court shall appoint as a board of directors of the district 8 three persons who are residents of the county or counties in which the 9 conservancy district is situated, at least two of whom shall own real 10 property in said THE district, one for a term of two years, one for a term 11 of three years, and one for a term of five years. WHEN A DIRECTOR NO 12 LONGER RESIDES WITHIN THE DISTRICT OR NO LONGER OWNS PROPERTY 13 WITHIN THE DISTRICT, A VACANCY IS CREATED ON THE DISTRICT'S BOARD

1 OF DIRECTORS.

2 (II) At the expiration of their THE DIRECTORS' respective terms of
3 office, appointments shall be made by said THE court SHALL MAKE
4 APPOINTMENTS for terms of five years.

13 (b) All special and regular meetings of the board shall be held at 14 locations which THAT are within the boundaries of the district or which 15 THAT are within the boundaries of any county in which the district is 16 located, in whole or in part, or in any county so long as the meeting 17 location does not exceed twenty miles from the district boundaries. The 18 provisions of this section governing the location of meetings may be 19 waived only if the proposed change of location of a meeting of the board 20 appears on the agenda of a regular or special meeting of the board and if 21 a resolution is adopted by the board stating the reason for which a 22 meeting of the board is to be held in a location other than under the 23 provisions of this section and further stating the date, time, and place of 24 such THE meeting.

(2) ON AND AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBSECTION (2),

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1 (a) THE BOARD CONSISTS OF NINE DIRECTORS, AS FOLLOWS: 2 (I) THE DIRECTORS WHO HELD OFFICE ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF 3 THIS SUBSECTION (2), REFERRED TO IN THIS SUBSECTION (2) AS THE 4 HOLDOVER DIRECTORS, AND DIRECTORS WHO FILL THE VACANCIES OF THE 5 HOLDOVER DIRECTORS, CONTINUE TO HOLD OFFICE UNTIL THE EXPIRATION 6 OF THEIR TERMS. UPON EXPIRATION OF THEIR TERMS, PURSUANT TO 7 SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (A) OF SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH (a), 8 THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PUEBLO SHALL FILL THE TWO 9 VACANCIES FOR THE HOLDOVER DIRECTORS WHO RESIDED WITHIN THE 10 CITY OF PUEBLO, AND PURSUANT TO SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (B) OF 11 SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH (a), THE BOARD OF COUNTY 12 COMMISSIONERS OF PUEBLO COUNTY SHALL FILL THE VACANCY FOR THE 13 HOLDOVER DIRECTOR WHO RESIDED WITHIN THE COUNTY OF PUEBLO. 14 (II) DIRECTORS ARE APPOINTED AND REPRESENT AREAS WITHIN 15 THE DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS: 16 (A) FOUR OF THE DIRECTORS REPRESENT, MUST BE RESIDENTS OF, 17 AND SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 18 PUEBLO, WHOSE INITIAL TERMS ARE THREE YEARS. 19 (B) THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PUEBLO COUNTY SHALL APPOINT FOUR OF THE ____ DIRECTORS. THREE OF THE DIRECTORS 20 21 APPOINTED PURSUANT TO THIS SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (B) REPRESENT AND 22 MUST BE RESIDENTS OF THOSE PORTIONS OF PUEBLO COUNTY NOT 23 LOCATED WITHIN THE CITY OF **PUEBLO**, WHOSE INITIAL TERMS ARE FOUR 24 YEARS. ONE DIRECTOR APPOINTED PURSUANT TO THIS 25 SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (B) REPRESENTS, MUST BE A RESIDENT OF, AND BE A 26 MEMBER OR DESIGNEE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE PUEBLO WEST 27 METROPOLITAN DISTRICT, WHOSE INITIAL TERM IS FOUR YEARS.

1 (C) THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PUEBLO COUNTY 2 AND THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PUEBLO SHALL JOINTLY 3 APPOINT ONE AT-LARGE DIRECTOR, WHOSE INITIAL TERM IS FIVE YEARS. 4 (b) DIRECTORS SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE RESPECTIVE 5 APPOINTING AUTHORITIES. THE RESPECTIVE APPOINTING AUTHORITIES 6 SHALL FILL VACANCIES ON THE BOARD, WHETHER BY EXPIRATION OF A 7 TERM OF OFFICE, INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF DIRECTORS, OR OTHERWISE. 8 (c) THE BOARD SHALL COMPLY WITH THE OPEN MEETINGS LAW, 9 SECTION 24-6-402, C.R.S., WITH REGARD TO ALL OFFICIAL BOARD 10 ACTIONS, INCLUDING THOSE RELATED TO ALL PROPOSED INCREASES IN 11 FEES ASSESSED BY THE BOARD.

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13 SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date -14 **applicability.** (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following 15 the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the 16 general assembly (August 6, 2014, if adjournment sine die is on May 7, 17 2014); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 18 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, 19 or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part 20 will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election 21 to be held in November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the 22 date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

23 (2) This act applies to conduct occurring on or after the applicable24 effective date of this act.

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
