101 CONCERNING A PROVISIONAL PHYSICAL THERAPIST <u>LICENSE</u>, AND, IN
102 <u>CONNECTION THEREWITH</u>, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

The bill allows the physical therapy board to issue a provisional license to applicants who have successfully completed a physical therapy program, met the educational requirements, and paid a fee. A person with a provisional license is required to practice under the supervision of a licensed physical therapist. The provisional license expires no later than

15	(3) A PROVISIONAL LICENSE ISSUED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION

17	IT WAS ISSUED. A PROVISIONAL LICENSE MAY ONLY BE ISSUED ONE TIME

19	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-41-115, amend

2	SECTION 3. Appropriation. (1) In addition to any other
3	appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the
4	division of professions and occupations cash fund created in section
5	24-34-105 (2) (b) (I), Colorado Revised Statutes, not otherwise
6	appropriated, to the department of regulatory agencies, for the fiscal year
7	beginning July 1, 2014, the sum of \$18,336, or so much thereof as may
8	be necessary, to be allocated to the division of professions and
9	occupations for the implementation of this act as follows:
10	(a) \$120 for operating expenses; and
11	(b) \$18,216 for the purchase of legal services.
12	(2) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby
13	appropriated to the department of law, for the fiscal year beginning July
14	1, 2014, the sum of \$18,216 and 0.1 FTE, or so much thereof as may be
15	necessary, for the provision of legal services for the department of
16	regulatory agencies related to the implementation of this act. Said sum is
17	from reappropriated funds received from the department of regulatory
18	agencies out of the appropriation made in paragraph (b) of subsection (1)
19	of this section.

21	SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
22	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
23	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
