# A BILL FOR AN ACT

SECTION 1. Appropriation to the department of human
 services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013. In Session Laws of

In Session Laws of 3 Colorado 2013, amend section 2 of chapter 231, (SB 13-266), as follows: 4 Section 2. Appropriation. (1) In addition to any other 5 appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the 6 general fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the department of human 7 services, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, the sum of 8 \$19,792,028 \$9,660,072 and 0.9 FTE, or so much thereof as may be 9 necessary, to be allocated to behavioral health services for the 10 implementation of this act as follows:

(a) \$17,672,420 \$8,498,133 for co-occurring behavioral health
services, crisis response system–crisis stabilization units, mobile crisis
response, respite services, and marketing;

(b) \$2,046,675 \$1,089,006 for co-occurring behavioral health
services, crisis response system-telephone hotlines;

17 (d) \$5,653 for administration, operating expenses.
