## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. House Bill 12-1224 created the consolidated communications system authority (authority), which is comprised of representatives of entities that use the statewide digital trunked radio system (system) as their primary means of public safety wireless communication. **Section 3** of the bill reorganizes the authority as a subcommittee (subcommittee) under the homeland security and all-hazards senior advisory committee in the division of homeland security and emergency management in the department of public safety (department). As part of the reorganization, the bill adds members and modifies duties of that body. **Section 5** makes conforming amendments necessitated by the reorganization.

Pursuant to the laws regarding creation of new advisory bodies, **section 4** schedules the subcommittee for sunset review and repeal in 2019.

Additionally, **section 2** directs the executive director of the department to undertake a needs assessment and formulate a business plan, in consultation with the subcommittee, regarding statewide radio communications and to report the findings to the joint budget committee prior to 2015.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 

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SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that, while interoperable public safety communications are a vital aspect of efficient and effective disaster emergency management, long-term funding, technology upgrades, and network compatibility solutions are elusive. There is therefore a pressing need to address public safety radio communications in the state, especially in light of the fact that certain areas in Colorado, some of which have been the sites of recent disaster emergencies, suffer critical gaps in radio system coverage and urgently need to be built out.

(2) In order to address these commonly known and highly critical

1 issues with the current statewide radio communication system, the general 2 assembly hereby finds it imperative to relocate the consolidated 3 communications system authority as a subcommittee under the 4 department of public safety because it is the principal department best 5 equipped to handle matters of public safety. Further, the general assembly 6 declares it necessary for that department, in collaboration with the new 7 subcommittee, to perform a needs assessment and form a business plan 8 to address any statewide radio communications needs. 9 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-716, add (7) 10 as follows: 11 24-33.5-716. Interoperable communications among public 12 safety radio systems - statewide plan - regional plans - governmental 13 immunity - needs assessment - definitions - repeal.
