A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING AN EXTENSION OF THE TRANSITIONAL JOBS PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

Current law directs the department of human services to administer a transitional jobs program through December 30, 2014. The bill extends the program through December 30, 2016.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26-2-1103, amend
2	(1) (a) as follows:
3	26-2-1103. Transitional jobs programs. (1) The state
4	department shall administer a transitional jobs program. The transitional
5	jobs program must:
6	(a) Seek to offer the opportunity to work in transitional jobs to
7	eligible individuals from July 1, 2013, through December 30, 2014
8	DECEMBER 30, 2016;
9	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
10	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
11	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
12	6, 2014, if adjournment sine die is on May 7, 2014); except that, if a
13	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
14	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
15	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
16	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
17	November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
18	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
